

RAHR Frequently Asked Questions

- 1. What does the \$1500 fee cover?
 - **COST** is covered by sponsoring Rotary Club
 - a. All meals and snacks; meals will be commercially prepared with consideration for all dietary restrictions.
 - b. Students will be provided a \$25 meal card for Friday night dinner. Should they spend more than this allotted amount, they will have to provide their own additional funds.
 - c. All program activities throughout the week
