For those of you who wish to petition your insurance company for coverage...

Here is information regarding how our office deals with insurance for the QT scan. We do not directly accept insurance for the scan. However you can submit to your insurance carrier for reimbursement. We have had some ladies have success with a few different carriers so far.

Currently we have an unlisted CPT code of **76999** which is a "catch all" code for procedures that do not have their own code. (Some insurance companies still prefer to use this code until the new code becomes active.)

The new CPT code **X579T** has just been assigned and released by the AMA. It will be officially active in January, 2027. Insurance carriers will have to determine the need based upon the number of women who call requesting that the QT scan be covered by insurance. From there, they will set coverage rates. SO, the more women who call requesting coverage... the better for us all!

One of our clients had success with this new code recently with United Healthcare even though it's not supposed to be officially used until January 2027. They agreed to cover it as a "Minor diagnostic procedure." A referral was needed from her doctor. In one case a pre-authorization was required. So it is best to call your insurance company and see what they require in advance.

We have also included a chart of some **Diagnostic Codes** (p. 2) which may be used as "hit or miss" options when attempting to get coverage for your QT Scan. **Please let us know which codes you want us to add to your "Super Bill" invoice so you can submit that to insurance and see what they will cover. Try to find maybe 3 that might apply to your situation/ condition.**

We suggest that before you contact your carrier, you become very familiar with the QT scan by reading our, "**A Letter for your Doctor,**" found on the home page of the website. You can also actually **share this letter with your doctor**, as many are still unfamiliar with this advanced technology. The ladies who have received reimbursement from their insurance were able to speak informatively using this letter and that makes the difference.

Currently, out of pocket cost is \$600 for a bilateral scan, and \$400 for unilateral, HSA/FSA eligible. Please call with any other questions. Booking is easily accomplished on the website.
