

- 1. Eight. Noah's wife, Emzara, alongside the wives of his three sons, are among the eight people who made it into the ark and survived the flood.
- 2. Raven and dove. To make sure the flood was over, Noah sent a raven and a dove outside the ark, and they came back with good news.
- 3. 13th-century BCA. *Under the leadership of Moses, the people of Israel trooped out of Israel, heading to the promised land.*
- 4. The sun and moon. While serving as the leader of the Israelites during the exodus, Joshua prayed to God to make the sun and moon stand still that they may win a war.
- 5. Tribe of Benjamin. Though there is scanty information in the Bible about Paul's family, he would always describe himself as "of the stock of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew of the Hebrews; as touching the law, a Pharisee."

- 6. Emperor Cyrus the Great. As narrated in the books of Ezra and Nehemiah, the Jews were allowed to end their exile in Babylon and return to Israel following the decree by the emperor.
- 7. The Sanhedrin. The Sanhedrin consisted of either twenty-three or seventy-one elders appointed to sit as a tribunal.
- 8. Thirteen. 13 of the 27 books of the New Testament were reportedly written by Apostle Paul, and he played a huge role in the propagation of the gospel of Jesus Christ.
- 9. He got thrown into a lion's den. A man with strong faith, Daniel refused to stop praying to God when the king gave a decree, which landed him in the lion's den.
- 10. 127. Sarah was 90 years old when she conceived and bore her son Isaac, and she died at the age of 127.
