


Hello, Friend!

Poetry Lesson for March

This month I have a lesson with a word that always sounds like how a child says part of their alphabet...LMNOP But, really, it's called: **Onomatopoeia**.

These poems use words that make a sound in your mind. Like "POP" - you imagine a popping sound. Or "SLURP" - you can hear in your mind the sound of someone sucking in their liquidy food. It produces images and sounds all in your mind. You "HEAR" the word. Advertisers have used it for years, as in: "Plop, Plop, Fizz, Fizz, Oh what a relief it is!" You remember that sound those large disks make in the glass when you drop them into the water. The cartoon above is similar to Onomatopoeia poetry as the wording creates a cringe in your thoughts of sitting on the john for bouts of... well, you get the idea.

Edgar Allan Poe was a master of onomatopoeia. Here is an excerpt from 1845's "**The Raven**":

• While I nodded, nearly napping, suddenly there came a tapping, As of some one gently rapping, rapping at my chamber door. "Tis some visitor," I muttered, "tapping at my chamber door— Only this and nothing more."

The use of words that are similar, rapping, tapping, napping. They make a reader lulled into a rhythm like on a see-saw...up, and down, and up, and down. it makes, you ride the ride.




