I Am A Christian

What does it mean to be a Christian? I think it's an important question to ask because we are living in a world where even church people have lost their identity. We kick off 2026 with a 2-month study on what a Christian is. It's easy to become so consumed in religious things, trying to be a good person, trying to be active in church, that we forget the foundation of who we are. I will be preaching a series of sermons out of scripture on what it means to be a Christian. To aid in the study as a church we will all be reading "I am A Christian" by Thom S. Rainier. The books

are provided by the church and they are very easy reading, only 112 pages. What we are doing involves more than just reading a book and gaining knowledge, it's about letting God transform us through what we learn and applying it to our life.

I believe every year churches should remind themselves, reacquaint themselves, with their purpose and God's expectations of them. 1 Peter 2:2 describes Christians in this way "Like newborn babies, crave pure spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow up in your salvation." Whether you are new to following Jesus or whether you have been a Christian for many years, God expects us to grow and He expects our church to progress.

The church never stands still, it continues to press on. When a church becomes comfortable, lacking desire to grow, it begins dying. Likewise a Christian is constantly growing, maturing and learning what it means to be like Jesus. Here's the reading schedule and preparation for the messages:

January 18	I am a church member pp. 27-42
January 25	I am a disciple. pp. 43-56


