Under Federal Employees Civil Relief Act (FECRA) and Nevada law homeowner associations may not foreclose on a unit owner's lien during a government shutdown or for 90 days after the end of a shutdown if the owner is a federal worker, state worker or tribal worker or a household member of such worker.

- "Federal workers" and "state workers" are employees of federal or state agencies or employee of contractors who has entered into a contract with a federal or state agency;
- "Tribal workers" are employees of a federally recognized Nevada Indian tribe that receives a majority of its funding from the federal or state government or an employee of a contractor who has entered into a contract with such a tribe:
- "Shutdown" means any period in which there is a lapse in appropriations for a federal or state agency or tribal government that continues through any unpaid payday for a federal worker, tribal worker or state worker employed by that agency or government;
- "Household member" is a person related by blood, marriage, adoption or other legal process and is currently residing with a federal worker, tribal worker or state worker affected by a shutdown.
