What is the difference between Brigance and Circle? Part 1

- Circle: Target population preschool students
- Mostly used in Texas
- Assessment focuses on specific literacy and math skills
- Provides quick results allowing teachers to inform instruction.
- Timed Test, students have 3 seconds to respond to questions

Uses Benchmarks



What is the difference between Brigance and Circle? Part 2

- Brigance-Target Population-infants to elementary students.
 Can be used for both special needs students and typical developing students
- Provides insight to a child's development, not just academics
- Used to identify developmental delays and implementation of IEPs.

Not timed

Uses norm-referenced and criterion-referenced tools.
