

 - March 12 Introduction, upcoming season information, expectations, rod/reel and line selection and knot typing and at home casting practice info
 - March 26 Juniors (knot tying, lures and Casting course) High School (Tourney Talk and Preparation)
 - April 16 Lure Building Workshop and Casting course
 - April 30 Hour long indoor practice and Meet the Boats/Coaches (weather permitting)
 - Discounted fishing poles will be available (FCFS)
 - Starter Bass Kit (lures, plastics, hooks, etc)
 - Donkzilla will be on site selling discounted lures (April 16/30)
 - Raffle tickets available for pickup (volunteer check must be on file)
- May 15 August 23 (classroom or on the water, weather permitting)

Practices

- Student / Parent must RSVP for practice each week
 - Plan is to use the SportsEngine smartphone application for communication
 - This helps the coaches to determine the number of boats needed that week
 - Students who do not RSVP may end up fishing from shore if there are not enough boats available
- Students are expected to be on time for practices with the required equipment
- Students on boats must help their coach take the boat out of the water, clean up the inside and help remove any
 weeds from the boat
- Students are expected to come to practice with line already spooled, arrangements can be made with coaches to get their reels spooled outside of practice times
- Students should spend time studying bass fishing techniques when not at practice

What should you bring to practices?

Please be sure to bring the following to every practice!

2 Rod/Reel Combos - 1 Casting / 1 Spinning - Bass Fishing setup

- Spooled full and correctly
- No large treble hook lures attached
- Snaps and Single Hooks are Ok

Back Pack with:

- Tackle Kit / Small Boxes (Bass lures only)
- Water/Water Bottle (No colored gatorades)
- Pliers/Hook Out
- Light Snack (No sunflower seeds)
- Sunscreen
- Ball Cap
- Sunglasses Safety (Preferably Polarized) REQUIREMENT
- Life Jacket correct size for the angler
- Rain Jacket

Weather – Be sure to pack based on the weather and be prepared for the worst!



 - \$40 per team (up to 2 student anglers)
 - Parents are allowed to fish with the student(s)
 - If only a single student angler, the parent's fish count towards the bag limit
 - Any MN body of water
 - Cannot fish same body of water if angler places 5th or better
 - Fish from shore / boat / kayak or canoe
 - Boat captain must register if fishing from boat
 - Use MNSATT approved measuring board
 - Drawing for Scheels gift cards for each participant per tournament





- 7 7 ½' Rod Med Heavy Fast, 30lb Braid Line, 20lb Fluorocarbon Leader
- Buzzbait, Carolina Rigs, Football Jigs, Frogs, Jigs, Topwater, Swim Jigs, Texas Rigs, Swimbaits
- 7 7 ½' Rod Med Heavy Moderate, 17lb Fluorocarbon Line
- Chatterbaits, Crankbaits, Jerkbaits, Spinnerbaits

Spinning Rods

- 7 7 ½' Rod Med Fast, 10-15lb Braid Line, 8-10lb Fluorocarbon Leader
- Drop Shot, Ned Rig, Neko Rig, Shakey Head, Spybait, Tubes, Wacky Rigs



Knots

Palomar – use for tying to hooks or lures - https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=TFk_Ktw2f1w
Surgeon – use for more action out of a lure
Uni-to-Uni – braid to fluoro / mono for leaders - https://youtu.be/IfFTTsdvrVs
Alberto – braid to fluoro for leaders - https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=zrVzp0n2gAw
FG – braid to fluro / mon for leaders - https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=ZPTzkep9xll

How to tie on a drop shot - https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=xuqaAq98BDA
Basically a Palomar knot with a longer Tag end that is fed through the eye of hook

Wet the line before tightening the knot!

Master at least 3 knots - speed and precision are key!



Casting

Accuracy, Accuracy Accuracy!

Practice flipping at home in a hallway or in the basement into a cup Put duct tape or electrical tape around the jig to cover the hook
