LOCAL HISTORIANS MEMORIALIZED

The EOHP and the City of Elgin honored Sydna Arbuckle and T. Berry at the Veterans Memorial Park amphitheater on October 11.

These well-known preservationists of Elgin history passed away in 2024 after years of service to the community and participation in EOHP.



In attendance were Coach Berry's daughter, Demita Huntley, and her daughter, Laura, as well as his siblings and other relatives. Mrs. Arbuckle's daughter, Ronda Kirk, and her family were also present, along with her sister, Judy Davis.



Participants in the ceremony noted the stories shared by these Elgin natives through their research and writing. Two crepe myrtle trees were planted, and plaques were placed to memorialize the contributions of these dedicated historians.

The *Elgin Courier* reported in its November 5 edition that "the plantings were chosen as both a literal and symbolic connection between the late Elginites and the city they loved."

"The crepe myrtles symbolize the broad roots that people in the community have," EOHP Board Member Deborah Cartwright said. "I think it's a wonderful representation of what Elgin offers as far as cultural roots, beauty, and growth."

She fully retired in 2017 as Special Projects Manager and Chief Dietitian with the Quality Monitoring Program, a program she founded.

Interviewing The People of Elgin

The Elgin Oral History Project is all about capturing the voices and stories that make Elgin unique—past, present, and what's still unfolding. Through interviews at local events like the Farmers Market, we're preserving not just history, but the everyday experiences that shape our community. In this video, filmed and produced by Story With Video, Board members Molly Owen and Bob Makela talk with vendors and visitors at the 2025 Elgin Farmers Market.



In 2025, EOHP added two live interviews to its YouTube channel. One was a series of brief interviews of vendors and participants in the Elgin Farmers' Market conducted by EOHP directors Bob Makela and Molly Owen. The interviews were collected in a documentary video format to showcase the community's support and involvement in the weekly market.

The other interview was a podcast featuring Byron Mitchell, the president of Elgin Independent School District's Board of Trustees. Mr. Makela conducted the interview. Mr. Mitchell provided insight into his life and the City of Elgin. This real-time interview is offered on YouTube and marks the beginning of more podcasts in 2026 to bring the history of the area to interested listeners.
