NO HUNTING & SLOW DOWN

There have been two unfortunate incidents within the subdivision recently.

The first was a property owner finding a doe and her injured fawn on their property. The doe had been shot with an arrow which remained in her neck. Authorities were called and the doe and her fawn had to be destroyed. Very late the following night another property owner observed someone with a light going along the back property lines, perhaps looking for a blood trail or their arrow. Hunting is NOT ALLOWED within a subdivision in Medina county unless the lot is greater than 10 acres. Two lots 10 acres or less cannot be combined to equal ten acres. If the lot you are hunting on is 10 acres or less you are in violation of the law. The proper authorities have been notified and strict enforcement has been requested. Should you become aware of someone violating this law, please contact the Game Warden or law enforcement.

The second incident involved two small dogs being hit and killed by a vehicle. It is understandable that an animal might dart from the side of the road and unavoidably be hit, but two? As drivers, we are responsible for safe control of our vehicles at all times and sometimes that requires slowing down and proceeding with caution. Perhaps the driver was distracted and didn't see them in the road. That is not safe driving. Should the pets have been in the road? Of course not! However, pets do get out and it is not always the fault of the owners. What wasn't seen was the two small children retrieving the bodies of their two beloved pets from alongside the road. Heartbreaking!
