




Suicide rates are trending upward





Suicide rates for females in the United States by






Suicide rates for males in the United States by age group, 1999-2018








Percentage of New Hampshire High School Students with Suicidal Behavior, 2019-2021



-Patients with GAD-7 scored 10 or higher (anxiety screen)	18.9%	19.8% †






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- Higher frequency and intensity of student mental health distress
- Students having a hard time staying in the classroom
- More social and behavioral issues at school
- Lack of available resources (therapists, inpatient services, help for families)
- Lack of understanding of the mental health system
- Need for improved care coordination
- Insufficient training for many school staff, including counselors




Case Presentations

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
- How to help disengaged, languishing high school students
- Middle school students are bullying and acting out in class
- Sharp increase in middle school students' negative and hate speech
- Helping parents support their kids
- LGBTQ+ students returning to school after release from the hospital
- Library with many unaccompanied children after school
- Library wanting to better support queer, neurodiverse, and bullied children
- Religious community experiencing uptick of kids in faith and identity crises

COLLABORATE MORE

- -Schools
- -Outpatient services
- -Families
- -Community resources

USE NEW TOOLS

- -Mobile crisis
- -Columbia Suicide scale
- -Mental Health First Aid
- -Anxiety management tools

IMPROVE PROCESSES

- -Return to learn plans
- -Support plans
- -Check in/ check out
- -Suicide risk screening

ENHANCE SCHOOL ENVIRONMENT

- -Pause moment during day
- -Create student groups that focus on mental health

SHIFT INDIVIDUAL APPROACH

- -More open communication
- -Build relationships
- -Talk less, listen more
- -Sit with kids longer



Project ECHO Impact on Participants

- More confident in working with students
- Better understanding of mental health system
- Increased knowledge of school resources
- More insight into what families are experiencing
- Helping students more pre-crisis
- Using mobile crisis services (9-8-8)
- Feeling less professionally isolated in the problems





A few final tidbits:

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- Facilitating ECHO for diverse groups requires more prep and monitoring
- Many participants' roles are evolving to include more youth mental health work
- Community youth supporters are important and need more help
- The youth mental health crisis is an all hands on deck situation
