Smestow Valley Local Nature Reserve Heritage Lottery Bid







Smestow Valley Local Nature Reserve (SVLNR) follows the natural valley of Smestow Brook alongside the Staffordshire & Worcestershire Canal forming a green corridor covering 51 hectares and approximately 4.5 kilometres long.



Stretching across western Wolverhampton it provides over 51 ha of high quality natural green and blue space within easy reach of 100,000+ people who live within 2 miles.



The canal, the railway walk, and surrounding nature reserve provide excellent habitat for a range of wildlife such as wildflowers, birds, insects, amphibians and mammals many of conservation priority in the UK, such as the water vole. SVLNR was designated Wolverhampton's first official nature reserve in 1998 and forms part of the Black Country Global Geopark.





The Staffordshire and Worcester Canal designed by James Brindley is over 200 years old and forms a key feature of SVLNR. The site also contains a number of Grade II listing structures including the distinctive landmark 'Meccano Bridge' which carries the disused railway line across the canal.



This unique heritage site linked to the city and the regions industrial heritage is in need of restoration and management. This project will allow us to enhance, preserve and highlight SVLNR.



SVLNR links the canal network to the North and National Cycle Route 81 which runs from Wolverhampton to Aberystwyth providing opportunities for a range of health improving activities such as walking, running, cycling and canoeing.



In August 2023 an application was submitted to The Heritage Lottery Fund to:

- Increase accessibility onto and throughout SVLNR including paths and access points making them inviting and welcoming.
- 2. Restore, highlight and promote the built heritage including the landmark Meccano bridge and the platform at cupcake lane.
- 3. Improve the natural heritage of SVLNR enhancing the canal corridor to protect and expand resilient habitats increasing biodiversity and climate resilience.
- 4. Create signage / wayfinding to promote routes and highlight heritage features improving the visitor experience. Increase engagement through heritage focussed community events and volunteering
- 5. Provide opportunities to train staff and volunteers


