23.103a	Election of New Chair The resignation of Cllr Chris Whitfield was noted. As a result the first item on the agenda, although not on the published agenda, was to elect a new Chair. Cllr Jayne Marshall temporarily chaired the meeting for the purpose of electing a new Chair. Cllr Tim Barrott was proposed by Cllr Marshall and seconded by Cllr Mason and was voted as Chair by a majority vote.
23.103b	Chair's Welcome Cllr Barrott welcomed everyone to the meeting and gave a vote of thanks to Chris Whitfield for the years he served on the Council and for the leadership and drive he had given to the Ardleigh Neighbourhood Plan.
23.104	Apologies and reasons for absence Apologies were received from Cllrs Thrower and Waters.
23.105	Public participation session relating to items on the agenda It was reported that an oak tree close to the dangerous junction of Dead Lane/Wick Lane had been cut back to improve visibility for drivers.
23.106	Declaration and Register of Interests No interests were declared.
	It was noted that several councillors had attended a training session arranged by Tendring District Council on the Code of Conduct. It was noted that this, or a similar session would be valuable for all councillors.
	It was further noted that the whole Council may require dispensations for the discussions related to the annual Precept, pylons and related issues and the Garden Community with individual councillors requiring additional specific dispensations. A form would be prepared and circulated to capture these.
	It was AGREED that the Standing Orders be amended to allow dispensations to be given by the Clerk rather than the full Council.

23/00837/FULHH Detached Cartlodge, 2 storey front &rear extension/ single storey side extension (Resubmission of 23/00377/FULHH). Blenheim, Bromley Road, Ardleigh, CO7 7SF. The Council had concerns about the scale of the application and would not wish the cartlodge to become a separate dwelling.
