23.134	Chair's Welcome The Chair welcomed everyone to the October meeting.			
23.135	Apologies and reasons for absence Apologies were received from Cllrs James Blyth and Jonathan Waters. Apologies were also received by Cllr Carlo Guglielmi (Essex County Council) and Cllr Zoe Fairley (Tendring District Council)			
23.136	 Public participation session relating to items on the agenda Two issues were raised by members of the public:- Encouraging residents to keep frontages neat/passable. The suggestion of an Ardleigh Clean Up Day was raised. Thanks were given to the resident for his hard work in voluntarily strimming some overgrown areas. Following the fatal collision on Dedham Road on Saturday 7 October, discussion was held on ways in which to improve this accident blackspot. It was noted that Cllr Guglielmi and a representative from Highways would be visiting the accident site to see what mitigation could be put in place with consideration given to a number of neglected/missing and broken road signs. Cllr Fontaine had requested permission for an additional Speedwatch site on Dedham Road. 			
23.137	Declaration and Register of Interests and Dispensations No interests were declared. It was noted that dispensations remained in place in respect of proposed pylons, substations, windfarms and for legal action relating to the food distribution centre. 	23/01333/FULHH Single storey rear extension. The Orchard, The Street, Ardleigh, CO7 7LD. The Council had no objection.				
	23/01295/FUL Extension to workshop and additional car parking (resubmission following lapse of period). Curtis Machine Tools Ltd, Martells Industrial Estate, Slough Lane CO7 7RU. The Council had no objection.				
	23/01387/FUL Proposed construction of HGV lorry park with ancillary welfare facilities and 3 metre high fencing; and 3 bay jet wash for cars. Ardleigh Service Station, A120. The Council had no objection.				
Other/ Appeals	Minerals and Waste application ESS/79/23/COL Waste recycling facility handling, processing and storing road planings; together with associated works. Land off Ipswich Road, Langham, Essex, CO4 5LZ. Further information would be sought outside the meeting and an objection submitted should it be felt that the operation would be detrimental to Ardleigh residents.				
23.140 23.140.1	Other Planning and Infrastructure Issues Tendring/Colchester Borders Garden Community (and related issues) It was noted the developers had opened up a further consultation. It was agreed to urge all residents to view the plan and submit their comments.				
23.140.2	Neighbourhood Plan (and related issues) It was noted that some changes to the Plan and its policies were proposed by the independent examiner. A further short period of public consultation would be the probable next step.				
23.140.3	Pylons, Substations, Windfarms and related The public meeting held on 15 September was attended by around 100 residents and was considered to be informative and useful. Presentations from the meeting would be shared to the website. Thanks were extended to the speakers, and volunteers who assisted on the night, including RRT Rapid Relief Team for providing free refreshments. Cllr Whiteley reported that he would be joining the Steering group of Essex, Suffolk, Norfolk Pylons action group and would provide a further link with the Council and the group.				
23.141	Highways, Public Rights of Way (PRoW) and related issues Road safety issues were discussed- see public participation above. It was noted that cars parking on Station Road were causing an obstruction and congestion as were cars on the A137 as it crossed the A120. It was agreed to contact ClIr Guglielmo to request his assistance in liaising with North Essex Partnership Parking if the issues continued.

23.142.1	 The following matters relating to community groups and amenities were discussed; Bottle Bank A second glass recycling facility had been provided at Prettyfields Vineyard, together with a collection point for the Tendring Primary Recycling Scheme. Speedwatch Further volunteers were required to ensure Speedwatch could continue to operate. It was agreed to publicise this request on APC website and the Ardleigh Advertiser. It was AGREED in principle to look into EV/solar energy for the Village Hall. 				
23.142.2	The consultation on an area-wide Public Spaces Protection Order (PSPO proposed by Tendring District Council (TDC), targeting dog fouling and nuisance dogs off leads was noted and broadly supported.

	Following the Order by Mrs Justice Lang in the case of Ardleigh Parish Council v Tendring District Council, a barrister had been identified who was willing to advise and represent the Council, an initial meeting held (subject to legal privilege) and quote obtained. It was resolved to instruct Simon Bell, to advise on merit and, subject to confirmation that there was an arguable case, to prepare updated grounds and to represent the Council at the oral permissions hearing costs as per the quote provided. Other actions and decisions relating to the case which would be required between meetings would be agreed and enacted using delegated powers following consultation with Councillors. Further financial pledges had been received and donations would continue to be sought.
