*Group registrations are required and are due June 11 (Breakaway I) and August 6 (Breakaway II). These are the deadlines for leaders to submit all information and payment to the office. Please set your own local due dates for students.

- Group registration should now be completed online. Payment may also be completed on-line (EMT), or one group cheque can be mailed to the office. Individual payments/cheques will not be accepted.
- Individual registration forms must be forwarded to the office (preferably scanned in one document), in keeping with Plan to Protect guidelines.

There will be only one registration deadline. YB 1 registration deadline will be June 11, and YB 2 registration deadline will be August 6 at a cost of \$275.

Paperwork isn't always fun (totally get it)– but it's necessary to getting our students and leaders registered on time and correctly! So don't procrastinate! 😊

Registration Reminders

- Group registration forms MUST accompany one cheque or EMT (give@paonl.ca) and all required information in order to be processed, including MCP #s, chaperones, and CRC checklists.
- No application will be processed without the appropriate number of chaperones. If your assembly cannot provide a chaperone, we suggest you contact a nearby assembly. There must be one chaperone for every five teens.
- If a chaperone name cannot be provided at the time of registration, a group may register "a chaperone" unspecified but a name and *CRC must be confirmed with the YB Office two weeks prior to the start of YB.* Any groups with chaperones unconfirmed by that time will have their registrations returned and not processed.
- Chaperones must be age 18+ for YB1 and 20+ for YB2.
 - Please note that these are *minimum ages*. There should be a 5-year age gap between a chaperone and his/her campers.
 - Chaperone Guidelines must be distributed to each chaperone prior to arrival.
- All students must register with a group. Individual registrations/cheques will not be accepted. However, all individual applications, signed by a parent/guardian, should be forwarded with group application.
- Camp age designations are as follows:
 - YB1 registrants must be in Grades 6-8 as of January 2025.
 - YB2 registrants must be in Grades 9-12+ (up to age 19) as of January 2025.
 - Please note the only exception made to the age designations is in relation to a Grade 9 student who may attend YB1 if necessary. We ask youth leaders to help us by demonstrating integrity in directing youth to the appropriate camp.

- Registration fees & deadlines are as follows:
 - Regular: \$275- YB1 by June 11 / YB2 by August 6.
 - Fees for underage children of pastors/chaperones: \$152.00/child.
- There will be NO ON-SITE REGISTRATION. Applications will not be received after the late registration date.
- Refunds will only be granted in the event of an emergency or if an individual becomes employed (an administration fee of \$30.00 is non-refundable). Refunds will only be issued after YB has finished and only with a written request received within 30 days after the end of camp. IMPORTANT NOTE: there will be no refunds for cancellations (for any reason) on the day the camp starts.
- Any damage to ECC facilities will be assessed by the ECC administrator and YB will invoice the local group for payment. (Minimum \$25 fee for damages).
- Room assignment will be done according to the designation on the group application. Please indicate on the form the individuals you would like to have roomed together. We will do our best to accommodate your designations, although final placement will be at the discretion of the registration personnel.
- Private/special request rooms for youth leaders/spouses will only be approved if space is available and if the appropriate number of chaperones are designated and accommodated near the students. Additional charges may apply.
- Chaperones will be roomed in proximity to their designated students in keeping with our protection policy. This includes those who are offering to chaperone for students from other groups, as well as ministry guests who are offering to chaperone students.



General Reminders

- This is a closed camp visitors are not permitted unless authorized by the Camp Director.
- Pets are not permitted on the grounds.
- Our NO TOLERANCE policy remains in place for those who may try to leave the grounds without permission. Offenders will be promptly dismissed from the camp.
- First Aid will NOT be issued by YB first aid personnel without written parental/guardian permission. No drugs/medication will be made available or administered by YB first aid staff.
- Please begin to pray for our camps that they will be significant events in the spiritual development of all who attend.

Great Expectations

We believe that attending Breakaway is an awesome privilege, but it comes with some pretty awesome – but totally reasonable – expectations for how you will behave and conduct yourself! We want Breakaway to be a positive, God honouring experience for all campers, as well as volunteers, leaders and staff. When we cooperate, show love, and demonstrate RESPECT, Breakaway will be INCREDIBLE for EVERYONE. Please read the great expectations below and commit to honouring them as you attend Breakaway 2025.

- 1. ACCOMMODATIONS AREA Under no circumstance is anyone permitted in the designated accommodations area of the opposite sex.
- 2. OUT OF BOUNDS The following areas are out of bounds:
 - a. Wooded areas unless accompanied and/or authorized by Youth Breakaway staff.
 - b. After curfew: Cabin area, unless billeted there, Ball field/basketball court, Trailer Court
 - c. Behind the following buildings: F.G. Bursey Tabernacle , Alice Garrigus Memorial Building, Fred Diamond Youth Building
- 3. LEAVING GROUNDS Permission is needed for anyone to leave the grounds. Only Breakaway Director can grant permission. Leaving the grounds without permission will result in dismissal from the Breakaway.
- 4. CAFETERIA Please express meal concerns to your chaperone who can bring it to the attention of the Breakaway Director(s). Extend appreciation and courtesy to the kitchen staff at all times.
- 5. **PROPERTY DAMAGE** The individual or group responsible must pay for any damage, deliberate or accidental. The cause of damage and cost to repair will be assessed by the Emmanuel Convention Centre administration and a bill will be issued following the camp.
- 6. VEHICLES All vehicles are to be parked in front of the Complex. At no time are you permitted to use vehicles, unless you have been authorized by the Breakaway Director(s) to leave the grounds.
- 7. AUDIO EQUIPMENT Only audio players with headphones will be permitted for private listening. All other audio equipment, e.g. speakers, etc. and are not permitted in the rooms. Headphones will not be permitted in morning and evening sessions.
- 8. DRESS CODE Students are asked to dress modestly and appropriately.
- 9. DISPLAYS OF AFFECTION Public and/or private displays of affection will not be tolerated.
- 10. CURFEW Please adhere to the curfew indicated in your Youth Breakaway handbook.
- **11. DRUGS/ALCOHOL/TOBACCO/ VAPING** The use of drugs, alcohol or tobacco will not be tolerated. Dismissal will result if found with items in your possession or participating in their use
