Wolves All Stars Charity Football Team is made up of former Wolverhampton Wanderers players, sometimes line-up's aided by some of those very closely associated with the club, who play in charity games around the Midlands to raise much needed funds for numbers of various charities.

Since their formation, the 'All Stars' have raised over half a million pounds for all the charities these events have supported.

The specific charities being supported this afternoon are close to a fair few of us on both sides, details of these causes are on the centre pages of this programme, let's hope we all do them proud.

Today's game, will also see the largest number of ex first team Wolves players gathered for a single event, with a number also appearing to purely support the event, sure this will make for a great photo opportunity at the end of the game.



Jody Craddock

A real Legend for us Wolves supporters, Centre Half & Club Captain Jody spent 10 years at Molineux where he made 237 appearances, also scoring 17 goals. Prior to joining the Molineux set up in 2003, Jody had started his career at Cambridge United before spending 6 years at Sunderland, at both clubs he made over 150 appearances. He finished his career at Stoke City and is the last Wolves player to have had a testimonial game at the club.

Seyi Olofinjana

Nigerian International midfielder capped 48 times. Seyi then made 135 appearances for Wolves between 2004 and 2008, before moving to Stoke City, Hull City, Cardiff City and Sheffield Wednesday. Sayi returned to Wolves as a coach from 2015 to 2021





Jackie Gallagher

4 Goals for this former Peterborough United forward amongst his 27 appearances in Old Gold. Torquay United and Boston United were also some of the clubs, Jackie has played for (1 FA Vets)

Tony Dinning

Starting in the Youths at Newcastle United, Tony made 191 appearances for Stockport County before joining Wolves in 2000 where he made 35 appearances, scoring 6 goals. Tony also played for 8 other league clubs after his term at Molineux.



Dennis Pearce

Signed from Aston Villa in 1995, defender Dennis made 9 appearances for Wolves followed by 117 at Notts County and 14 at Peterborough United before ending playing days at a number of non league clubs.

Paul Jones

Signed from Walsall, where he made 143 appearances, after a loan spell to Wrexham, in 1989, the midfielder made 5 appearances for the club until moving on to Kettering Town in 1991.



Adam Proudlock

Product of Wolves youth set-up, striker, 71 appearances, scoring 13 times. During this spell went on loan to Clyde, Forest, Tranmere & Sheffield Wednesday, who he eventually joined in 2003

Simon Osborn

After making his name at Crystal Palace, Simon joined Wolves via Reading and QPR, scoring 11 goals in 162 appearances for the Molineux team from 1995 to 2001.

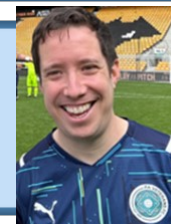

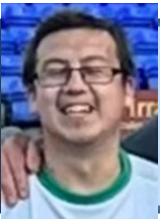

FA Veterans FC

This group of players were formed after the demise of the charity 'Football Aid', which restricted its games after the COVID pandemic and subsequently became insolvent in 2021.

The group are made up of those who regularly appeared in these games previous to 2021. To date, we the Vets have arranged game at 22 stadia in England and Scotland and are next in Wales for two games in November.

In fact, a few of the Wolverhampton Wanderers legends, both playing and in attendance this afternoon, either played in or supported various Football Aid games at Molineux over the years events were arranged.

In May this year, the team played at Sutton United in the culmination of fund raising over it's Summer games for the Paul Alan Project, which was set up the unfortunate passing of Paul, suffering Cardiac Arrest at the live televised match between Fulham and Blackpool, which raises charitable monies to install Heart defibrillators near grass root footballing areas. Along with funds raised by member Darren Winnard during a game at AFC Bolton, 2 brand new defibrillators have since been installed with monies raised.

Kevin Ashley

88 Appearances for Right Back in his 4 years at Molineux, chipping in with a goal as well, after signing from Birmingham City in 1990, Kevin went on to make appearances for Peterborough United and Doncaster Rovers.

Micky Holmes

Midfielder who made 83 appearances for the club between 1985 and 1988, scoring 13 times. Signed from Bradford City, Micky moved on to Huddersfield Town, Rochdale, Cambridge United, Torquay, Carlisle United and Northampton Town after Wolves.



Colin Taylor

Striker with 180 Appearances in the Old Gold, scoring 44 Goals between 1975 an 1984. Also played in the Football League for Huddersfield Town, Gillingham, and Mansfield Town.

Matt Forman

Starting his footballing career at Aston Villa, Matt moved to Molineux in 1986, where in the following years till 1988 he made 29 appearances, netting on 5 occasions for the old Gold. Went on to represnt a number of non-league teams around the Mid-



Matt Hill

Defnder Matt played for Wolves between 2008 and 2010, making 15 appearances. Previous to his psell at Molineux, he played for Bristol City and Preston North End, and post, QPR, Barnsley, Blackpool, Sheffield United and Tranmere Rovers.

1p36 Deletion Syndrome is a genetic condition in which a small amount of genetic material is missing (deleted) at the tip of the short arm of chromosome 1. 1p36 Deletion Syndrome causes birth defects, minor changes in physical appearance and learning difficulties of varying degrees. There are health problems that are associated with the syndrome such as sight and hearing problems, low muscle tone, epilepsy and heart defects.

Breast Cancer Now is a charity in the United Kingdom which was formed in 2015 by the merger of Brest Cancer Now Campaign and Breakthrough Breast Cancer. It is the United Kingdom's largest breast cancer charity. Its declared "Action Plan" is "by 2050, everyone who develops breast cancer will live"

Breast Cancer Now's flagship fundraising event is their 'wear it pink' campaign. This is one of the UK's biggest fundraising events having raised over £33 million since it launched in 2002 .

A charity supported by Jase and his fundraising just before the sad loss of his wife Lucy to Breast Cancer in 2015, when Jason began 'Legacy for Lucy'.

To Date, with your help, we have raised over £385,000 between all three charities.
