

What is this about?

STISA calls on hotlines, helplines and operational services to demand the tools needed to support survivors of online sexual violence:

- A case management solution to process reports and removal requests
- Robust hashing technology for effective removal of intimate content, at scale.

If you don't ask, you won't receive it.

The Challenge

- 1 in 7 people have experience sextortion online
- 99% of deepfake abuse targets women

New laws are coming in the EU and US. Services must be ready for increased reports and regulation. Manual processes aren't enough, survivors need fast removal and protection

What you need and how to get it

1. Recognize your need

Manual processing of reports and content removal are slow and do not scale to the increased volume of requests. Survivors need swift removal and prevention of re-publication. Tools make that possible.

2. Use the right tools

- Abuse Management: deploying a case management solution is a must for any organization receiving reports from survivors. STISA recommends the adoption of the <u>open source solutions developed by AbuselO</u>, or an equivalent.
- Robust Hashing: using robust hashing algorithms and hash databases to store intimate content from survivors (with their consent), secure its removal and prevent its republication is a must. STISA recommends the adoption of the <u>Nexus platform by Videntifier</u>, or an equivalent.

3. Be honest about funding

Many organizations lack resources for these tools due to the lack of understanding as well as being underfunded to support survivor's needs. Only those who will ask will receive it. If funding is a barrier - say so.

Funders cannot help unless you speak up.
