She bought a raw gourd at Canton, went home and cut it open, planted some seeds, and her journey began. Today she buys her gourds from large gourd farms in Arizona and California. She does relief power carving, wood burning, painting and decorating on gourds.

Working with gourds is her passion and she has won various awards with her gourd art. She won Best in Division at the Texas Gourd Festival, President's Choice in the South Carolina Gourd Show, several first place awards at the Texas Gourd Festival, and was

winner of the Gourd Challenge of the American Gourd Society. Her work was published in the American Gourd Society Magazine.

# Nov. 14, 2020 • 1-4 p.m.

It's been quite a year, and there is a lot to reflect on. What better way to think and process than with art?

In this 3-hour workshop, students will be introduced to the linocut printmaking process. Linocut printmaking is a form of fine art printmaking where an image or pattern is cut or carved into blocks of linoleum to make a reusable printing plate. Using a single-color



linocut approach, students will create prints from their uniquely designed plates that consider reflection and memory – whether literal reflection like in a mirror, or a figurative representation of a past experience. Through contemplation and learning new techniques, we will explore and have fun! Leaving with not just one, but a set of prints of your very own design.

To maintain the necessary safety and sanitation protocols in place, each participant will be provided their own set of tools to take home after the workshop.

The fee to participate is \$50 per person. Register now to reserve your spot.

# Paper Quilling Workshop

Roll, twist, and pinch colorful strips of paper into three-dimensional works of art! Paper quilling is fun and easy.
