Monthly VAL Meeting

Abstraction from Chaos Presenter: Sharon Serrago Oct. 8 - 7 p.m.



In the demonstration, Sharon will show how she begins a painting from scribbles and unrelated lines, working toward a discovered subject and a painting that is founded upon design and color theory.



Sharon is a local area artist, teaching weekly watercolor and acrylic classes at her studio in Richardson, TX, a suburb of Dallas. As her teaching strength lies in design and color theory, her classes always focus on strong fundamentals. Sharon's ability to quickly spot problem areas in paintings and her adeptness at offering solutions has caught the eye of many art clubs and organizations who have subsequently invited her to present demonstrations, offer critiques of members' works, and judge competitions. While she frequently paints realistically and in almost all mediums, oils, watercolors, pastels, acrylics, and collage, Sharon is most at home when painting abstracts in acrylics. Her firm belief is that anyone can learn to paint if he is willing to do the study and the practice that fine art requires. In her words, "when inspiration fails the artist, design and color theory can capture a painting headed toward failure and can pull it through to completion of an excellent work."

Sharon is a signature member of Southwest Watercolor Society and has been accepted into numerous exhibitions including Western Federation Watercolor Society, Alabama WS, Georgia WS, Illinois WS, Irving WS, Houston WS, Red River WS and many others. With her foundation in design and color theory, Sharon gives her students the tools that allow them to stretch beyond the boundaries of "rules" and create wonderful works of art that truly touch the soul.

Every artist needs to own not only their creations, but their intellectual property as well. In this session, Tom Maddrey explained why it is so important to register your copyrights and establish your trademarks, as well as answered questions about protection and fair use. 

Artist Pop-Ups

Artist Pop-ups will be resuming this Fall for four Saturdays: 10/5, 10/12, 10/26, and 11/2. Contact Chuck Hendrickson (chuckh816@gmail.com) if you would like to participate in one of these events.

The "Artist Pop-Up" series is done in conjunction with the MCL Grand Theater. It involves having an artist "pop up" in Wayne Ferguson Plaza (across the street from the theater) and create art for about two hours. These events will be scheduled for Saturday evenings, 6-8 p.m. The City is offering a \$50 honorarium for each event. VAL will pay the artist, then submit an invoice to the City for reimbursement. The type of art is open: painting, clay, collage, sketching, stamping/printing, ATCs, woodcarving, acoustic instrument, etc. It could also involve passerby participation if you want. Further, the artist(s) can display artwork for sale while she/he/they create art (10% commission to City applies). There are a variety of sun or shade locations in the park for the artist to work. Note: stakes can't be driven into the ground in the Plaza.
