These are things you will ultimately need for oil and cold wax. I will also have things for you to experiment with.



Bowl Scraper - This is what we paint with.

Gamblin Cold Wax Medium

I will have extra, so don't get anything larger than this size. \$8.21



Paper palette for oils Any brand.

Freezer Paper from the grocery store works just as good. I will have some freezer paper you can use.

Baby Oil - This is what we clean up with. No turpenoid!

Surfaces to paint on: Any combination

Gesso Boards any size

I will bring some also

Canvas Panels 8x10 or 11x14

I will have some of these for extras

Canvas 11x14 or 16x20

Canvas is harder to use with cold wax, but not impossible. Bring some only if you already have some laying around the louse.

Any of these surfaces will suffice. Ideally, you will need 9 surfaces (3 per day), any kind, any size no larger than 11x14. Gesso boards work best. Try to get at least one of those. Michaels and Hobby Lobby regularly have sales where you can get 10 panels for \$10.00. They are good for learning and practice.

Oil Paints: Gamblin and Daniel Smith are my favorites

White Black Red Blue Yellow

Any others that you like. I will bring **many** that you can experiment with.

Gloves. I will have some you can use if you do not have any.

Any brand will do. I use the ones below from Amazon.
