Join us at Forest Lake and help the crew remove Garlic Mustard, an invasive species that inhibits forest understory growth by blocking light and out-competing native flora species!

Garlic Mustard is an easy-to-remove non-native plant. Alger Conservation District, in partnership with the L2L CISMA, has been treating this site for several years, with improvements being recorded year over year. Last week, another site on Forest Lake was discovered (pictured below). We anticipate this invasive species going to seed within the next two weeks. Once the seeding processes begin, all work **MUST STOP**; otherwise, the seed would likely spread faster!

If you have two hours, a pair of comfortable boots, and would like to make a lasting impact on the local community, sign up to help remove Garlic Mustard from Forest Lake.
