Never have I ever seen a reaction to an event in our community like the one after the awful attack and subsequent death of our front page puppy, Poppy.



Poppy was only small, but she had the biggest heart. The chihuahua won the love of our community during her five little years. It took a bit of convincing for her owner, Elaine McInnes, to take on Poppy, when it was suggested to her that having a pet could help with the depression she was suffering, whilst grieving the loss of her mother, father and husband. They had all died in the space of one year. Elaine's concern was loving a pet and having it also die would put her through the pain of loss again. She relented and chose a chihuahua as they have a long life span and Elaine thought that Poppy would outlive her. Provision was made for Poppy to then live with Elaine's daughter Leana.

Little did anyone expect was that poor

Poppy would be snatched from her pusher pram by a savage unleashed dog.

Poppy was shaken so savagely her back was broken, her lungs damaged and her legs paralysed, resulting in Elaine having to make the painstaking decision to have her put down.

At the time of the attack Elaine was weeding at the Community Gardens and Poppy was, as always, sitting nearby watching Elaine and world go by, when the dog came in and snatched her. Elaine, almost 75, dived in to save Poppy and missed her by a smidgen. She then threw herself in to try and save her little companion. Other members of the gardens rushed to help her and people passing by also stopped to offer support and assistance.

#### Elaine and Poppy are a community icon in Woolgoolga.

Elaine included Poppy in every daily activity that she could. She started putting Poppy in the pusher so she could get exercise herself, Poppy would walk a certain distance until her little leas were too tired and then Elaine would push her the rest of the way. Pops would sit patiently while Elaine attended meetings or met with friends at coffee shops. All sorts of people would stop to pat Poppy, she had a knack of making you feel like the most important person she had seen that day, even strangers. If she knew you she would stand up and wag her little tail vigorously. She particularly loved Robert Watkin and Billy Flicker who both fussed over her like little kids.

Poppy and Elaine joined the Fluro Friday





Tribe several years ago and were always the best and brightest couple there. On R U OK? Day Poppy had the cutest little yellow tutu that she would don.

The two of them would visit the Retirement Village and bring joy to the residents. At Christmas time they would walk the streets giving out lollies, visits to both the high school and primary schools would involve mass patting from the students.

When the news was out of Poppy's attack, as always with this town, community kindness kicked in with a Go Fund Me to help with Vet fees raising over \$3000 in two days. <u>Woodland</u> <u>Pet Cemetery in Lowanna</u> offered to cremate Poppy and for Elaine to choose a nice urn for her ashes at no charge. The Kindness Crusaders, Ollie and Tahlia, cooked up a couple of nice healthy meals for Elaine. The March Family kids came with cupcakes and company for Elaine. Flowers, chocolates and wine gifts started arriving at Elaine's door. It was truly amazing.

She certainly was a very popular Poppy. Brad and I will miss her as will thousands of others. May she rest in peace.

### Woopi Whale Tales

Whale Watching is just one of the most amazing and relaxing things you can do. Just sit on a headland and gaze out to sea. You can do it on your own, with a friend or even the whole family ... and it's FREE. We hope you enjoy this months Whale Tales.

Hi everyone, I hope you are seeing some more action out there.

The main body of the migration has started moving past our coast line. It seems to be a bit later again this year - June, July and August they are travelling north, August,

September and October they are travelling south. Last year the whales were returning well into November, it may be climate change or it could be the increased numbers. Let's go with both.

In the main body of migration are the female humpbacks averaging 12 to 16 metres in length and weighing approximately 25 to 40 tons. Humpbacks become sexually active after seven years of age, giving birth every two to four years, with a gestation period of around 11 months. The females have spent six months feeding and building up fat storage in southern oceans for the journey to the warmer waters of the tropics.

At birth, humpback calves are four to five metres in length and weigh up to two tons. The baby humpbacks can be born any time on the migration north, looking the same greyish colour as a dolphin. The baby will develop its own unique markings within a few weeks.

After birth, the mother will raise the baby to the surface for its first breath of air, staying on the surface until the baby is able to swim. Mothers and babies will continue north to warmer waters, new born whales have no blubber/fat at the time of birth so they have to build up a layer of blubber before they can go back to the icy cold waters down south. They drink up to 600 litres of milk per day, with a fat content of approximately 48% (human 7%). It takes around 12 weeks for the blubber to grow. During that time the calf will be taught things such as fin slapping, tail slapping and breaching. Behaviours are taught to the young straight away (one day we will find out why), so usually there is a lot more action when the whales are coming back down south. When mum and the calf are ready they will return to the cold waters to feed. Relying on her fat storage, the mother may have not had much to eat, if anything at all, over the last four to six months. After returning to the cold feeding grounds, the mother and newborn will stay around the southern oceans, feeding and building up strength for one or two years before the baby is strong enough to make the journey up and back again.

### FANTASTIC NEWS WEST WOOLGOOLGA SPORTS COMPLEX IS ON THE GO!



A state of the art Multi Purpose Centre is part of the West Woolgoolga Sports Complex catering for indoor sports, dance and theatre performances, gymnastics, weddings, and so much more

It has been a long time coming but the final piece of the jigsaw fell into place when Kevin Hogan MP announced in June the \$10 million towards the constructions of the playing fields and the Northern Beaches Multi-Purpose Centre.

Estimated project costs of \$24.7 million have now been realised through three tiers of government.

Al Milroy, Chair of the Community Working Group said, "The community of Woolgoolga and the Northern Beaches have been extremely patient and diligent working together with Council over the years to pursue this sports complex for the future benefit of our community".

The West Woolgoolga Sports Complex is a greenfield site on the western side of Solitary Islands Way, opposite Woolgoolga High School. The project consists of the following components: Civil Works – Solitary Islands Way access, internal roads, parking and services.

Playing Fields – for AFL, cricket as well as multi use fields, drainage, lighting and amenities.

Northern Beaches Multi Purpose Centre – two indoor courts (Basketball and Netball) multi-purpose rooms, stage, kitchen and amenities.

The detailed design stage funded by Council has commenced and is expected to be completed by the end of the year. The design team will seek to validate the considerable feedback and information collected over the years from potential users and in accordance with Council's adopted Sports Facility Plan and Indoor Sport Study. Engagement around this validation will be via the community working group, and shared with various sporting, youth, cultural and community groups. Works on the site are expected to begin later this year with major construction works due to start in early 2021. It is anticipated that construction will take about two years and create over 140 direct and indirect jobs.

### PETE'S PUSH UP CHALLENGE



When Peter Glattback, owner operator of Taffy's Café accepted the Push Up Challenge, as a chance to raise money for Headspace and bring awareness to mens mental health, he didn't just do the push ups in his loungeroom, he decided he wanted to film them in beautiful scenic spots around the Northern Beaches.

He pushed away at several beautiful back drops like Serenity Beach and Look at Me Headland, surrounded by kangaroos, out the front of his café on a bench, on top of his car and as you can see from the photo in a Norfolk Pine! What the? *You can view the full video of this online if you click on the picture.* On one of the days, Peter had set his camera up and climbed up on to a rock, completed his 25 push ups and came down to find his camera had fallen over, so he had to get back up and do them again. The second time, he had technical problems with his phone camera and had used the wrong lens. He was struggling a bit the third time around.

Struggling is what this challenge is about, its to bring awareness and raise money for mens mental health.

This is a world wide challenge, the Australian version started in 2018 and the 3046 push up goal over the 21 days is the number of men's deaths by suicide that year. Each day a target was set for the number of push ups to be done based on men's mental health statistics.





Unbeknownst to Peter his nephew, back in Wales was also not only doing the challenge, but also doing it in scenic and spectacular places. See the photos here on the left.

"Neither of us knew the other was participating in the challenge. So from opposing sides of the world, two Glattback's doing it for men's mental health, both trying to find unusual spots to do the push ups." Peter said. ### Meet Wendy Townsend

There are so many interesting people in our community. Some have been here for a long time and some only new. Woopi News would like to share with you a little bit of both. Wendy, a new resident, tells us a little bit about herself. How beautiful are these textile masterpieces she creates.

All of my life I've been doing some form of textile art, I used to do embroidery making doll's clothes, always doing something with my hands.

As a young woman I made some of my clothes for myself, then marrying

young and having four daughters I made most of the clothes for my children also.

When my youngest daughter started school I became a member of the knitters guild in Sydney starting the southern Sydney branch. I then purchased a small wool shop business, discovering that I had a natural ability to be able to design and write a pattern to knit a garment. I then moved into a bigger shop, developing my business, when my children became independent, I began running workshops, teaching knitting techniques to design and make simple garments all over Sydney, including Sydney Uni leisure courses.

At the same time developing a cottage industry in designing and writing patterns for my designs in which I had over 20 people knitting for me.

I became part of "Dorian Scott's Australian Designs" an up market store at the Rocks in Sydney. Unfortunately, as most things in fashion they eventually come to an end.

One of my previous workshop students was moving to Japan to teach English at a college. She was telling me that in Japan at the time, being the mid 90s, native English speakers could earn a living in Japan teaching English and English conversation practice.

I moved to Japan when my youngest daughter turned 18 (going on 28 ... lol). I enrolled in a fulltime Japanese Language College where I studied for two years.

To cut a much longer story short ... I went to the UK to visit my youngest daughter who was at that time in the Orkney Islands. That's where I discovered felting. One of the most ancient discoveries when sheep were kept enclosed dropping their fleece, urinating and walking on it which created felt.

Modern days, the wool fibre is available commercially ready to felt in many colours. Different colours can be mixed together to create a new colour as can be done when painting.

In Australia I starting teaching people 'how to felt' at leisure classes, while selling artworks I had made at various shops.

I have now moved to Woolgoolga near one of my daughter's Lu Townsend. These days I continue my textile art for my own enjoyment.

#### END OF AN ERA

The Woolgoolga Rotary auction has been a town fixture for the last 30 years and kept tonnes of useful items out of landfill. It's about to come to an end with a giant garage sale of all remaining items over the weekend of Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> and Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> July.

The Rotary Shed behind the CWA building in Beach Street will be open from 9am-2pm both days and all items must go...so come grab a bargain some furniture, household goods, bric-a-brac. Social distancing rules will apply, hand sanitiser will be available and numbers inside the Rotary Shed at any one time will be limited according to current restrictions.

Rotary is hoping the many locals who have volunteered at the auctions or donated goods or bought a memorable item will turn up and share a story or two with the Rotarians on duty.

"Many locals have furnished first homes or set up the granny flat or accommodation for student children with affordable furniture and household goods. Many have found and restored an antique, a treasure from a bygone era. Still others such as berry pickers have furnished their accommodation then donated items back at the end of their stay. Many who are downsizing or moving have donated goods that are still useful, avoided the hassle of garage sales and found their move easier and more rewarding as a result", according to Rotary Club President Pam Stone.

Woolgoolga Rotary has funded many local projects and helped out in national and international disasters through funds raised at the auctions. Contributions to building the Seniors Centre, the retirement village, Yeates Hall, local sporting facilities, the toddlers pool at the swimming pool, the Heritage Walk, many youth programs...none of these things would have been possible without funds from the Rotary auctions.

Retired auction director Dick Matthews records that over the 30 years, more than three quarters of a million dollars have been raised from auctioning used goods. Each year over \$8,000 is donated to the various groups that help Rotary run the auction...from schools and pre-schools to scouts, red cross, rural fire services, community gardens and sporting clubs.

"The auction has been a valuable fund raiser for many local community groups, not just Rotary", he said.

But times have changed and Woolgoolga Rotary Club is now looking at trialling some new exciting ways to raise funds for the community.





### Mind your Mind

#### Sit up straight!

We can all probably remember a time we were told to 'stop slouching' by a well-meaning adult. The full benefits of good posture may not have been known to them but it was a wise instruction. Research shows that posture impacts on brain function and mood. Good posture = better state of mind!

Take a moment to slump in your chair or stoop over as you walk. Drop your gaze and cross your arms over your chest. Notice how you feel.

Now sit up or stand up tall, roll your shoulder back a bit and look straight ahead. How do you feel now?

One study done by Pepper and Lim, 2012 assigned a slumped or straight posture to 74 people in New Zealand. Their blood pressure and heart rates were measured as they completed a series of tasks designed to assess their mood, self-esteem and stress levels. The slumped participants reported feeling more fearful, hostile, nervous, quiet, still, passive, dull, sleepy, and sluggish. Good posture was associated with higher selfesteem, less social fear and fewer negative emotions. The participants with good posture even had stronger pulse responses than their slumped friends.

This is just one of many studies showing how mood is directly impacted by our physical posture. This is such a powerful piece of information for us all to use in taking an active role in maintaining good mental health. Something so simple as shifting our posture into a 'open' and 'tall' position to boost our mood and confidence is like a superpower we might not have known we had! Next time your mood is low or you are feeling stressed, stand up, reach your arms overhead and take a couple of deep breaths as a re-set of your mood. Got a job interview? Sit up tall and look your potential employer in the eyes. Kids grumpy after too much screen time? Get them to lay backward over a couple of pillows (positioned under their mid back) on the floor and stretch their arms overhead for a few minutes.

And a gentle reminder that the key to implementing healthy habits is first slowing down and becoming aware of how we find ourselves. Pause and take a conscious breath.

### Law Learnings

### WORKERS COMPENSATION FROM TWO PERSPECTIVES - WHICH ONE WOULD YOU CHOOSE?



Thank you to my four year old for the inspiration for this article.

Bob the Builder was climbing up a ladder while at a worksite when he suddenly fell, landing heavily on his lower back. Bob was in pain but wasn't sure what he should do – report the injury to his employer and go see a doctor, or try to shake it off and go back to work?

#### Scenario I,

After seeking some advice Bob reports the injury to his employer and consults a doctor. The incident is noted in an incident report by the employer. Bob's GP advises he has a lumbar spine injury and needs some time off work to recover. The GP issues a Certificate of Capacity noting that Bob is totally unfit for work until the next review date in 28 days. Bob provides his employer with the certificate and lodges a worker's compensation claim with his employer's workers compensation insurer. The claim is accepted by the insurer given the injury noted by the GP is confirmed by the employer's incident report. The insurer pays weekly benefits for the period that Bob is incapacitated and pays for all medical expenses. Bob's condition improves and he is able to return to work on light duties in a gradual return to work plan negotiated with his employer, the insurer continues to make up his wage. Unfortunately, Bob's condition deteriorates, surgery is recommended. The insurer approves the costs of the surgery and pays Bob's wages while he is recovering. Following the surgery Bob is unable to return to heavy manual labour so the insurer pays for his rehabilitation and retraining into a Project Management position. Bob also receives a lump sum payment for the permanent impairment he has due to his lumbar spine injury.

#### Scenario 2,

Bob decides to continue working as he does not want to get his employer offside and risk losing his job. Bob experiences ongoing lower back pain over the next few months which affects his ability to perform his work duties. The employer is unhappy with Bob's performance at work and their relationship deteriorates. Bob finally decides to go see his GP and explains that his back pain began when he fell off the ladder at work. The GP provides a Certificate of Capacity noting that Bob is totally unfit for work due to a lumbar injury sustained seven months ago. Bob provides his employer with the certificate and lodges a worker's compensation claim with the insurer. The claim is denied because it was lodged more than six months after the injury. There is also no evidence that Bob sought any medical treatment for a back injury in the previous seven months and the employer has no knowledge of his fall from the ladder. To make matters worse, Bob needs lumbar spine surgery, but this will need to be delayed while Bob disputes the denial of liability by the insurer in the Workers Compensation Commission. Unfortunately, the only witnesses to the fall were the machines on the work site and since they do not talk in real life, they are unable to provide any evidence to support Bob's claim.

In NSW injured workers can access funding grants for legal advice and assistance in respect to workers compensation claims. The advantages of getting advice soon after an injury can make all the difference as outlined in the scenarios above.

### Nick's Nerdy News



Due to the high level of cancelled, rescheduled or missed appointments to get your NBN connected of-late, NBN Co will test a new online booking tool that allows end users to reschedule inconveniently timed technician appointments.

The tool will allow the end user to reschedule appointments directly with the NBN Co through a link to an online booking tool via SMS to solve the bottle-neck process in place now.

The standard protocol, at this time, is for the end user to contact their ISP (Internet Service Provider) to then contact NBN Co to organise this change in circumstance, or issue, which results in a skirmish of communication between multiple parties until the problem is rectified. This could take weeks and be extremely frustrating.

The tool has a trial date set for mid-July (although unconfirmed) but aims to bridge the gap between NBN Co and the end user (for the first time since released) and will allow the consumer more control, and knowledge (I feel) with the connection process - the onus being pushed back toward NBN Co.

In addition to facilitating changes for customers that can't be home for an initial appointment, it is also understood the tool can be used by a customer to alter preference times for an appointment that needs to be rescheduled because it was missed by the NBN contractor assigned to it.

Whether this online tool is a success, or even gets released, I believe it will be a good incorporation to the connection process, and relationship between NBN Co and the end user.

#### **BILL BOARD**

My journey into photography is very much a self indulgent one, it comes after a diverse career including business management, media, advertising and marketing. I've always had a camera of some sort and enjoyed taking snaps but when I found myself in Canberra, without a job, I decided to get a 'decent' camera and teach myself how to use it and I haven't stopped learning since.

If I had to define my favourite type of photography it's probably not so much about the end result. ### The Woopi that Was

This month Woopi News brings you an old time story from a lovely local lady that we have become great friends with over the past few years. She has a long history with Woolgoolga having lived here, then left and returned, followed by some of her lovely family. We hope you enjoy Laurie Pilon's trip down memory lane.

### The Robinson Family History - Woolgoolga

Our connection with Woolgoolga started about 1930 when my grandparents, Sydney and Katie Spencer began camping here for six weeks every Christmas with their five teenage children. Travelling to Woopi from Bendemeer (near Tamworth), where Grandad was headmaster, was a two day adventure, not like the four hours it takes today.

Timber, bananas and some dairy were the main industries and the jetty was the focal point of the town. There was no electricity but the jetty was lit by gas lamps, and was literally a shining light. Ships would load and unload day or night and a lot of the town's social activities were around the jetty. There was great excitement when electricity came to town in about 1932.

The much loved Beach Pavilion (about where playground is now) was the social centre. It was a large timber hall, with a stage one end and huge wooden shutters on east and west side so sea breezes could flow through or they could be closed during gales. Concerts, parties and celebrations were often held there, but most remembered are the dances through Christmas holidays. Held every afternoon, the dress would be shorts or cossies and bare feet and at night we dressed up!

It was at a dance at the Pavilion that my father Arthur "Robbo" Robinson met my mother Jean Spencer. They were married in Tamworth in 1939 and made Woolgoolga their home, passing on their love of the town to their five daughters, Lindsay, Laurie (me), Beverley, Frances and Roslyn. Dad had moved down from Queensland during the depression and got a job on Billy Richard's banana plantation, later buying his own 'planto' off Holloways Road.

I was born at Sunnyside Hospital, in February 1942, delivered by the legendary Dr Yarad. Two days later, looking very grave, he told the young mothers on the verandah that "The Japs have just bombed Darwin". One said cheerfully "Well waddya know! They'll be bombing Australia next!" The war was very real in this area, all homes with blackout blinds, plantations wired ready to be ignited if Japan invaded and guns and lookout points on headlands.

Lubbo Singh was the first Indian here and worked for Billy Richards and Dad, I remember him well. He had white hair, white beard, white turban and white clothes, made from flour bags, which he sewed himself with some help from my mother. Although he had very little English, after work he would sit happily in the dirt with Lindsay and me, playing dolls with us. We loved him. Billy Richards was an icon of the town. As well as his 'planto', he owned the general

section, china, homewares, linen, clothing, hardware and an agriculture section. Groceries were sold by the pound, in brown paper bags. Mr Richards would always keep the broken biscuits from the bottom of biscuit tins to give to us kids. Wartime Ration Coupons were still being used for sugar, tea and butter and Grandad would trade his sugar ration tickets for extra tea! As well as deliveries from Richards' shop and Waterhouse's shop, deliveries came from butcher (Occy Featherstone and later Roy Atkins of Meat Palace), Milkmen (in a pail left on your front step), Baker (Laugher's), Green Grocer and Rawleighs – selling exotic things like cochineal, vanilla, Friar's Balsam herbs and spices!

We didn't have a doctor, dentist, chemist or bank, but we had a bootmaker, basket-

store in River Street (where

maker, milkbar, picture theatre - and of course, the Seaview Hotel. I remember the joy of my first meal there. Pudding was tapioca and green jelly sublime! We loved going up to the top of the "Princess Tower" and surveying "our kingdom".

It was very exciting when the National Bank opened at "Toppy" and then Don Clinch's Chemist in 1952. In those days, the town centre was at "Top Town", with not much down in the beach area. Bootmaker, Basket maker, Holland's Garage, Lee's Guesthouse and tennis court, general store/milk bar - and later pinball parlour.

My grandparents and parents contributed greatly to Woolgoolga. Grandad organised War Effort Rallies to raise funds and also to which he wrote for Grafton Examiner, is now displayed on the board near the new Surf Clubhouse. Grandma founded the original Red Cross in Woopi, and later, after Red Cross was reformed my mother Jean, became Patron.

In 1953, when Woolgoolga Central School was short of teachers, Jean was talked into returning to teaching - a big step and quite controversial at that time for a mother with five kids, including a preschooler. There began a 25 year love affair with Woopi School and kids, whose welfare was always her biggest concern. She instigated swimming lessons in the Lake (Woolgoolga Lake was always "The Lake"). For many years, until the pool was built, most of the school would file down there on

organise work on plantos for those away at war. He and Grandma both had St John's Ambulance Medals (which I still have) and with no doctor here and a terrible road to Coffs, Grandad was called on a lot. Bob (Doughy) Laugher told me Grandad set his broken arm when he was twelve and the doctor in Coffs was so impressed he wouldn't reset it. Grandad also did quite a bit of research and his story of the Buster wreck,

Friday afternoons. Annual Swimming Carnivals were also held there. Jean played the piano, taught the school choir and produced many items for school concerts.

Jean, together with Don Clinch, Thea Featherstone and a few others formed Woolgoolga Musical and Dramatic Society (later simplified to Woolgoolga Players). For years they produced plays, skits, revues and musicals such

as White Horse Inn and Jill Darling. Jean was Producer and or Leading Lady in many of these shows, as well as helping write scripts for Revues. These were widely acclaimed and drew audiences from Grafton and Coffs as well as locals. That was when the roads were so bad and winding that the local bus to Grafton would have a 10 minute stop at Halfway Creek for a toilet break or a quick cuppa before climbing The Range.

Both Arthur and Jean were very involved in local sport. Arthur in Surf Club and playing cricket, tennis and footy, and later on the Sea Horses Committee for many years producing their weekly newsletter. Together they helped form Woolgoolga Hockey Club, with both Men's and Ladies teams doing well in Coffs Comps. It was often hard to find transport and on many occasions we all travelled to Coffs in the back of Dad's old Morris truck under a rigged-up tarpaulin when it was raining! Great fun, but not for modern times. Arthur was also foundation member of Woolgoolga VRO carrying out many sea rescues.

As well as playing tennis comp with Arthur and daughters, Jean was involved with Anglican Church, Probus Club, View Club and Red Cross.

After working in local NAB I went to Teachers College in Sydney and then taught at Westlawn, Repton and Coffs before going to West Wyalong where I met and married farmer Rod Pilon. Our four boys - Tony, Brett, Mark and Michael were born at West Wyalong, before we moved to Terrigal in 1972. We made the decision to retire in Woolgoolga and moved back here in 2002. What a great move. (Our son, Brett from XS Surf and his wife Ronni and sons Noah and Xander joined us here a year later). Our little village was a wonderful place in which to grow up - and our bigger, but still beautiful village is a wonderful place in which to retire.

### The Big Blow

Ces Marsh (Woolgoolga's first police officer) and Lyle Wilson's fishing boat "Grace", wrecked after being washed off its mooring in the cyclone of 1937 which also washed away a section of Woolgoolga Jetty. This began the demise of Woolgoolga as a chosen site for a safe harbour. A planned sea wall from Safety Beach out to and extending off Woolgoolga Reef was cancelled and Coffs Harbour was chosen as the preferred site. Woolgoolga bay was open to huge seas from the northeast which battered the jetty on numerous occasions.

Narelle had her daughter Kylie and grandson Lorcan (which is gaelic for little fierce one if you're wondering) with her.


So all six generations in one photo. Pretty cool.



CrossFit Woolgoolga and King Tide CrossFit turned the negative of being forced to close down during the corona virus pandemic into a major positive.


