DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

I recently did a Billings Behind the Scenes segment for the local Fox and ABC news affiliates. No, there is no risk that Hollywood will be calling me any time soon, I felt like I sort of fumbled my way through it. Before the shoot, I put together a minute and a half of script, and when I talked to the interviewer, Heather Ohs, she said "oh, that's too much, what are two main points that are most important for you to cover?"

I had about 1 minute to think, but it didn't take me that long. What I wanted to say about your Arts Association was its long history for giving back to the community, and our commitment to continue that legacy.

The Billings Arts Association began in 1954 with artists, actors, writers, musicians, and 'interested observers'. The founders were members of the Montana Institute of Arts. One of the early projects of the organization was a fund drive to make an art center of what was once the county jail. As you all know, that is now the Yellowstone Art Museum. So we are proud of the Association's contributions to the community over its many years of existence. My hope is to continue that legacy by supporting our artists in their creative journey, and supporting the communities in which we live and create. We do this by offering a supportive environment for our artists to create, through artist and community collaboration, and through financial support offered in our Images Art Grant program.

To be clear, all of this was in place long before I started, with shows, community relationships, and grants. So any kudos for this vision go to Elizabeth and the Board she led, and I'm sure the leaders before her. I'm just riding the coattails, and so far it is a great ride. We are a small organization, and our memberships or donations give us the resources to fund and grow this very important outreach. Thank you all so much for your membership, and your support.



IMAGES ART GRANTS

The Billings Arts Association Images Art Grant encourages and supports art education in our community. We know how art and art appreciation has shaped our lives, we hope we can do a small part to help shape the lives of others.

The BAA Board has approved giving a grant to an artist who wishes to further their art career. We will sponsor a partial scholarship for a MAP (Montana Artrepreneur Program participant. The Board voted to fund a \$350 scholarship (it costs \$500 to join the training program and there are additional expenses the participant will need to cover for travel and weekend cadre meet-ups). We want to encourage artists who want to make a career of creating.

The Art Auction is one of the museum's largest fundraisers, bringing thousands of patrons to visit the exhibition and attend auction-related events. It is one of the YAM's most treasured opportunities to spotlight the artwork of our regional artists, up-and-coming talent, and to inspire patrons who are beginning their collections.



Calling All Artists for Mobilize the MAGIC City Artist in Residence Opportunity

[Billings, MT]— Thanks to an opportunity funded in part by the National Endowment for the Arts, the City of Billings Planning and Community Services Department now has a Call for Artists open for a contract with an artist-in-residence (AIR) or pair of artists-in-residences. The selected artist will work with the Mobilize the MAGIC (Making Art Grounded in Community) City project.

Through the Mobilize the MAGIC City project, AIR will be tasked with advancing the City's goals including creating a robust and creative public engagement process, promoting economic vitality, beautifying the built environment, and improving safety. The AIR position will span one year. At the conclusion of this project, the AIR will have created a minimum of two placemaking hubs along Billings' first bikeway, a feasibility study for a public arts commission, and a placemaking playbook documenting the successful processes used. The exact form of creative placemaking hubs will be decided collaboratively with residents. Examples of potential placemaking hubs could include street art, a neighborhood gathering space, or a sidewalk stamped with poetry.

Non-profit Smart Growth America describes creative placemaking on their website: "Coined by Ann Markusen and Anne Gadwa Nicodemus for the National Endowment for the Arts in 2010, creative placemaking refers to the process in which 'partners from public, private, non-profit, and community sectors strategically shape the physical and social character of a neighborhood, town, city, or region around arts and cultural activities.' Creative placemaking advocates believe

that community development projects benefit from the participation of artists at the onset of projects, and on the planning and design teams that shape our communities." Interested artists can learn more and download the Call for Artists (Bid Packet) at https://www.billingsmt.gov/bids.aspx?bidID=1109. Applications will be accepted until November 28, 2022 at 5 pm MT.

While the City of Billings is the official awardee for the Our Town grant, "Mobilize the MAGIC City" is a collaborative effort that would not happen without several very important partners. The Healthy By Design Coalition (https://www.bbdyc.org), the Billings Arts Association (https://www.bbdyc.org), and Billings Councilmember Denise Joy in addition to Planning and Community Services Department staff will all serve on the project leadership team.

John Kennedy called the meeting to order at 3:05.

Minutes from the July meeting had been distributed electronically and were approved.

Financial Report

Cash in the bank is \$6,479.00 but it was noted that not all of the artists have cashed their checks from sales at the Gainan's show. Payments to the Secretary of State were made for by-laws changes and for current non-profit status.

Membership

It was noted that active membership is up over last year. We have 84 current members but will continue to email the newsletter, *Images*, to all 120 members in the database. How can we better engage members once they join? We typically have 15-22 artists attend ArtShop. Membership committee was discussed. Outreach? John and others have been recruiting new members through the side hustles of Urban Sketchers and Plein Air Painters. Mentors to call or email new members with a personal reminder of upcoming ArtShop (they get John's News you can use and updates already)? Are members enjoying the discount benefits with their membership cards? See website for details. Members must be currently paid up to participate in shows.

Old Business

Art Supply Swap participation was not enough participation to justify booking Crooked Line. We will drop it even though it is a good idea. We were competing with some other big "pre-holiday" events in town. Maybe revisit the concept in a few years.

Calendar of Events for next year

Backside will again include events and Board contact information. The Board discussed inclusion of a couple of new events and deletion of no-go events. Hopefully, the cards will be ready to hand out at the Holiday Brunch Gathering for your 2023 planning!

Sandstone Panels

All of the artist slots for 2023 are filled, but a few reserve artists are needed to fill in if there is an unexpected vacancy. Ev is taking that on from Laurel who has done a fantastic job of managing the liaison between Sandstone Co-op and BAA. Streamlined payment was discussed and we will look into making it easier for all parties involved.

New Business

Website Update

We are converting to a hosting site that allows easier updates by the Board, our PayPal payment service, and ...drum roll, please...a members only page that will be chock full of educational info (from ArtShop presenters and more) as well as lists of venues around town that will accept individual artist's work to be hung. Once you have logged in (you create a unique password) the site will remember you on that device. Look for more changes as the website evolves.

Artist page In addition to a free link to an individual artist's website (which the artist is responsible for hosting and maintaining), you will be able to have an "Artist Page". The Board voted to create this additional category for a \$10.00 annual fee. It will be created by John and others with website permissions, and include an artist statement, photo of the artist, 6 photos and up to 4 revisions per year. More details will be in the newsletter.

Images Grant Program

How do we get more participation from area art educators? Discussion about previous distribution of information. Keep at it and talk it up among teacher acquaintances. John introduced the idea of a partial scholarship for a MAP (Montana Artrepreneur Program participant. The Board voted to fund a \$350 scholarship (it costs \$500 to join the training program and there are additional expenses the participant will need to cover for travel and weekend cadre meet-ups). We want to encourage artists who want to make a career of creating. We will work on an application which will be posted to the website. If we create a "donations" area on the website, that money needs to be delineated to fund "Grants". \$1000 for Images (educator) grants and \$350 for the MAP participant grant. If more \$\$ goes in, more grants could be awarded. Educators could apply annually and the Board would consider merits.

Artist Spotlight

Short video clips will be produced (not necessarily edited and polished) showcasing where our artists make their art and the mediums / styles they create in. They will be posted on the BAA website (takes the place of the Artist Interview Book and can easily be updated)

Storefront (empty?) or other venues for showing art / pop up shows / etc

While the Board likes the idea, no one has any definite ins with realtors or business people downtown. Check with the Downtown Business Alliance again as the staff has changed.

Action Items:

John will do a video interview of Ev to test his prowess for the Artist Spotlights. Continue website updates.

Joey will ramp up the social media shouts and info about upcoming events.

If you are commenting on our BAA ArtShop Group's page, please keep in mind that we are non-profit, a-political, non-denominational, and art focused. We value individuality and artistic expression, however keep the online posts art-centric. Take a flash drive down to Econo Print to transfer files from past BAA projects that can be kept in the BAA Gmail drive for Board members to access.

Ev will check with Karen M about participation in the Grant program.

Sandy will verify the dates with Mick Gainan for Gainan's Member show in September 2023.

Elizabeth will contact Molly at YAM about BAA artists doing demos during 1st Fridays or ArtWalks. Will check with Katherine Jore re Holiday gathering. Will verify dates for DanWalt Gardens "shows". Call McCormick to verify take out for holiday brunch (done, we're on).

The meeting was adjourned at 4:15 p.m. Next meeting will be Jan 19 at 3 p.m. at Mazevo Coffee 819 Grand Ave.
