Astoundingly, it also contains edible grains, a potential that Léon is exploring in his dishes. While his culinary breakthroughs may seem insignificant to some, each delicious morsel is a step forward towards kinder food practices, a healthier ocean and a sustainable economy.

Lemon Blueberry Bread

Yields 1 loaf

Ingredients

1/3 cup butter, melted

2 eggs, room temperature

3 tablespoons lemon juice

1 cup sugar

1 1/2 cup all-purpose flour

1 teaspoon baking powder

1/2 teaspoon salt

1/4 teaspoon baking soda

1/2 cup plain sour cream or Greek yogurt

1 cup fresh or frozen blueberries

2 tablespoons lemon zest

Preheat oven to 375° F.

In medium mixing bowl, whisk butter, eggs, lemon juice and sugar. In separate bowl, mix together flour, baking powder, salt and baking soda.

Add flour mixture to butter mixture alternately with sour cream, stirring gently. Fold in blueberries and lemon zest.

Pour into greased 8 x 4 inch loaf pan. Bake at 375° F for 20 minutes. Turn oven down to 350° F and bake for additional 30-40 minutes. Cool for 10 minutes. Transfer to wire rack. Glaze if desired while warm.
