Dear Friends and Faithful WBF Partners,

Over the past several weeks, our lives have been marked by prayer, wise counsel, and a deep seeking of the Lord's will. It is with humility and a sense of awe that we share this next step in our journey. We have been asked to serve as Mission Directors for the agency, and after much prayer, we believe this is where God is leading us.

This was not something we pursued or planned. In fact, it has stretched us in ways that remind us once again that God often calls us beyond what feels comfortable. Yet, through the confirmation of the Holy Spirit and the counsel of trusted voices, we are stepping forward in faith—trusting that the One who calls is always faithful to equip.

As we enter this role, we do so with a unique perspective that God has graciously given us over the years.

For 16 years, we had the privilege of pastoring—walking alongside people in their joys, struggles, growth, and surrender. Following that, for the past 14 years, we have served as missionaries on a foreign field. We have lived the reality of stepping away from what is known and familiar, learning to depend on God in new ways, and embracing both the challenges and the incredible blessings that come with obedience.

We have not done this perfectly. We didn't step onto the mission field until we were in our mid-50s. We never fully mastered the Spanish language. There were many moments when we felt inadequate, uncertain, and stretched beyond our ability. And yet—God used us. Not because of our strength, but because of our willingness. And that truth has shaped us deeply.

As Mission Directors, our desire is not simply to lead—but to serve. We want to come alongside missionaries who are faithfully sacrificing and serving all over the world—to encourage them, strengthen them, and remind them that they are not alone.

At the same time, our hearts are burdened with another growing reality. We are seeing fewer and fewer people willing to surrender to full-time ministry—especially to missions on a foreign field. The call is still going out, but the response seems quieter. We want to be part of changing that.

We desire to share our testimony—honestly and openly—in hopes that others will see that you do not have to be perfect, fully prepared, or “have it all together” to say yes to God. You simply have to be willing. God is not looking for the most qualified—He is looking for hearts that are surrendered. If He can use us, He can use anyone.

It is our prayer that through this new role, we would not only support those already serving, but also help inspire and challenge others to step out in faith—to go, to serve, and to trust God with the unknown.

We step into this calling with grateful hearts, knowing we still have much to learn, and with a deep dependence on the Lord for wisdom, strength, and guidance. Thank you for your prayers, your encouragement, and your faithfulness. We ask that you pray for us—that we would serve well, lead humbly, and always point others to Christ. It is truly a privilege to serve those who are serving around the world—and to encourage others to join in that mission.
