

SAUL AS A TYPE OF CHRIST (PART 3)

- Saul was chosen and good and there was no one like him; Jesus was chosen and good and there was no one like him.
- Saul was sent by his father to seek that which was lost; Jesus was sent by his father to seek us who were lost.
- God instructed Samuel to anoint Saul King over Israel so he could save his people from their enemies; Jesus was anointed as messiah i.e. King over all so he could save his people from their enemies.
- After Saul travelling for three days in a different land, the lost were found and he arose; After Jesus being dead and in a different place for 3 days, he arose and the lost were saved.
- After this, Saul was made messiah; just like after this Jesus was also made messiah.
- After Saul's rising, he was first met by people at a tomb which didn't belong to him; After Jesus rising, he was first met at a tomb which didn't belong to him but a rich man.
- The spirit of God came on Saul after 3 days and he was transformed into a different man and he was met by more people; The spirit of God came upon Jesus after 3 days and he was transformed into another man and was met by more people.
- Notice that Saul was not seen by those who knew him for 3 days (look at the phrase "in time past"; Jesus also wasn't seen for 3 days.
- After this, Saul went to a high place; Jesus also ascended to heaven after this.
- Saul's mission was to find the asses; Jesus' mission was to save the lost.
