

## HAMAN AS A TYPE OF CHRIST

- Shortly before his death, Haman fell down and made a petition to queen Esther for his life; shortly before his death, Jesus fell down and made a petition to God for his life.
- While Haman was talking with his family, people were sent to bring him before the king (gentile) and Esther (Jew); while Jesus was talking with his family (remember his family are those that hear God's words and do them i.e. his disciples), people were sent to bring him before the Jewish priests and gentile ruler.
- The King first went out of the presence of Esther before coming back in and giving his verdict; Pilate first went out of the presence of the Jews before coming back in and giving his verdict.
- On account of the petition by the Jew Esther, Haman was ordered, by the king, to be executed by hanging him on a tree (gallows H6086); on account of the petition by the Jews, Jesus was ordered by the ruler, Pilate, to be executed by hanging him on a tree.
- Haman died in place of Mordecai, who disobeyed the king by not bowing to Haman and was destined to die but rather had his life continue and became a ruler because of Haman's death; Jesus died in place of us who disobeyed God and were destined to die but rather now have eternal life i.e. continuation of life and will become rulers in the world to come because of Jesus' death.
- The king's wrath ceased after Haman's death; God's wrath ceased after Jesus' death.
