Second, I have been going through the stash of Ebenezer and baby quilts that I have left and they still need labels attached to them. There are about 15-16 left. If someone could come by the shop and sew them on, I would really appreciate it.

I have about 25 more that need to be quilted and would love to have some help with those if anyone is inclined to do so. I also have sorted and boxed up 295 more pair of crocheted baby booties that will go this week to The Birthing Center and the Wilkes Pregnancy Center. (BIG THANK YOU to Judy Martin for this donation!)



Third, I am planning a couple of workdays at the shop for kit-making (Ebenezer and baby quilts). I have sorted many fabric donations and I'm in the process of hunting coordinating fabrics to complete the kits. I will announce the workdays at our September guild meetings. If you don't like to cut kits, we also need volunteers to quilt quilts and bind quilts, which you can do at the shop or at home.

Fourth, my shop recently became a member of the Quilts of Valor Foundation. This is a national organization that recognizes with a quilt, all living veterans of any of the armed services that have been touched by war. I have application forms to nominate a service man or woman. I have these available at the shop and also plan to bring some to the guild meetings. These should be returned to me so I can get the nominees registered with QOVF. If any guild members would like to make a quilt for a serviceperson, they would have the opportunity to present that quilt to the nominee during their ceremony.
