President's Message

It was President Abraham Lincoln who, in 1863, declared Thanksgiving an annual national holiday. Voter ID Initiative...What is it & Why do we need it?

The California Voter ID Initiative is a proposed state constitutional amendment that would require voter identification in all future elections.


Because it would be a constitutional amendment, if approved by voters it would apply in all future elections without exception.

You may have seen petitions being circulated for this initiative. The goal is to collect 1 million signatures statewide to place the measure on the November 2026 ballot for all California voters to decide.

Some people ask why this should be on the ballot. In recent elections, concerns have been raised about possible fraud and validation of people casting votes.

Did you know that you currently don't need to show identification to vote in person? If passed, this initiative would

require election officials to verify citizenship before a person is eligible to receive a ballot. It would also require voters to show a government-




issued photo ID for in-person voting or provide the last four digits of a government ID when voting by mail.

Supporters say this initiative is needed to protect the integrity of our elections by verifying that voters are citizens and addressing concerns raised in past elections. As we know, a woman in Orange County registered her dog and the dog actually cast a vote in two recent elections. We need to protect the voting process. Help get the VOTER ID INITIATIVE on the ballot for next year.... Sign the petition!
