

The Christmas Fund is a Welcome Gift to Many!

On Sunday, December 12 we will be taking an offering for the UCC Christmas Fund, one of the five ways we support the denomination nationally.

Together our money makes an impact for those retired clergy who are struggling financially and perhaps physically as well.

Thank you for any contribution you can make. You may write a check to FCCM and put Christmas Fund in the memo or go online and make a donation there to the "Christmas Fund."

The Organ is Broken!

Present Condition of organ. Our organ is 50 years old and appears to be on its last leg. None of the buttons (pistons) that allow me to set up different combinations of sounds work. The pistons allow me to quickly move from one sound to the next. Without the pistons working when I begin a piece I cannot change the sounds easily. This makes hymn playing virtually impossible. The speakers have static noises that come and go. Certain notes at times do not work. I never know when a note is going to fail. Rob Linquist, the former Allen representative came to FCCM when I first started my position at church. At the time he suggested we would be wasting our money by putting much money into it. He has since passed away and the new Allen rep. Jim Swihart from Carmichael agreed that the organ is too old to try to fix it. A new sound board would cost 6k and we would still have other problems and the sound would never get any better.

Options: I asked Jim about buying a used digital Allen Organ. He said the only type that comes up for sale are usually 30 years old and we would have some of the same problems. The Worship Committee and Finance & Facility Committee are looking into the possibilities of a new chapel organ. We have been in conversation with both the Allen Organ Representative and the Rogers Organ Representative. Our present organ is a first-generation digital instrument. Both committees were impressed with the exquisite sound that present-day organ digital technology offers.

History: The history of our church, from its beginning, knew the value of organ music in worship. They had an organ right from the start. We want to carry on this beautiful and meaningful tradition that enhances our worship and helps lead our singing. In addition, a new organ will enable us to hold concerts as an outreach to the community, be used as an educational tool for our children and youth, and accompany many soloists and singing groups.

We will keep you posted as we continue our conversation with the organ reps and listen to current organ installations. We will have opportunities to take a visit to where they have been installed. 




