



Pastor's Article

Recently I have been learning a lot about faith. Now I don't mean "faith" in terms of religion or belief. I'm talking about faith as an action, the ability to believe in someone or something.

Jesus never actually said to people that he healed them. He either told them that their faith had made the whole, or he gave them a command to do something. I had an odd experience recently that startled me into a new realization of how strong someone else's belief in us can move us forward.

While visiting my daughter in Florida, I lost an earring at the beach. It wasn't very expensive, but it was precious to me because Daryl gave the pair to me for my birthday this year and I love wearing them. I was very upset and telling my daughter about it. We looked in our picnic basket, the car, our towels and our bathing suits to no avail. "Let's go back and look at the beach," she said."

"Do you really think we will find it there?" "Let's try," she exclaimed and so back to the beach we went. As we entered the park, I told the attendant taking our money that I had lost my earring and asked if anyone turned one in to the office. "No," she said, "but I have faith in you." "Well, we are going to hunt," I said. "I have faith in you," she repeated and gave me a thumbs up.

It seemed odd. Why would she say that she had faith in me? It seemed a strange thing to say when the earring was either going to be there or not. However, it kept ringing in my head. We approached the area where we had been and at first nothing, then all of a sudden right next to the picnic table, there it was.

My daughter and I hugged each other and danced for joy. What stayed with me for days though, was the phrase, I have faith in you.

It was a warm, confident feeling, given by a complete stranger. How often do I doubt myself, second guessing decisions and actions? How many times do I worry if I am saying or doing the right thing?

"I have faith in you." That kind of statement is an affirmation that I did not even know I needed. We were facing difficult days with my daughter's illness and I was anxious about the long travel to see my brothers and sisters. Every day, I kept hearing, I have faith in you. Sometimes all it takes is someone else believing in and encouraging us!

It was a gift and I share it with you so we can remember that we are walking together and we will be okay through these very tough times where hate rages, fires burn, the climate is amuck, and wars still seem endless. I have faith in you! Faith, that together, we can be the love and healing this world and earth need.


Christian Education Has a New Director!
