Dear Ones,

Vice-Moderator's Musings

Since September, I have been using this spot in The Nugget to discuss the various teams and committees established by our bylaws to help conduct the business of our church. Joining one of these teams and committees is an important way for you to participate in the work of the church, but some people do not

feel comfortable in such a role. I have good news! You can participate in the work of one or more of our teams without being a committee member! In fact, several of our teams need church members to volunteer for various tasks sporadically or occasionally (and you don't have to attend meetings to serve this way).

For example, Parish Care can use your help if you'd like to offer meals like soups or casseroles to members who are ill. They could also use people willing to drive a member to health appointments, or to church services or events, or to visit a member who is hospitalized or shut-in. The Hospitality Committee always appreciates help in the kitchen before and after services, and also needs a steady stream of volunteers to bring a treat for members to enjoy during "coffee hour" on Sundays. The Worship Team is currently recruiting ushers, greeters, and sound technicians for our Sunday services. Membership & Calling could use help in connecting with visitors and prospective church members, as well as members who haven't attended lately. Christian Enrichment has needs for help with the bimonthly Family Program, the children's Sunday School, and other activities they sponsor for our spiritual growth and education. You can also support the Outreach & Social Justice Team by working on one or more of the projects they facilitate for our members, without being part of the planning team. The Finance & Facilities Team always needs volunteers for help with the grounds and with setting up equipment for various events. So, you can see, there are lots of opportunities to assist one or more of our teams, without officially becoming a regular team member or attending monthly meetings.

The reality is that we need every member to find the ways that they can best contribute to the life of our church, to meet our mission and goals. We are a relatively small church, with big goals to serve our God, our community, and our world. 
Water Conservation Corner


Is our freshwater percentage increasing or decreasing?
