Pastor's Article Learnings from Lent

As we are now in the season of Lent, we once again practice the rituals of these holy 40 days leading up to Easter. During Lent many people practice a discipline of giving up something as a sacrificial act of deepening their faith. In these modern times, many people prefer to add something to their rituals.

Each of us will determine what is calling to us to enrich our walk with the Holy One. For some, it might be giving up T.V. or wine or cholate or obsessive working. For others it might be adding a good deed to every day, a moment of prayer for someone else, a cheering phone call or a donation to a place of need.

Why is this so important? I am reminded that other faith traditions have similar practices. The Muslins practice a month long fast of Ramadan, the Jewish people Practice fasting during Yom Kippur and my own ancestors, the Native American tribes, use fasting for spiritual awakening. A UCC writer Craig Gabriel says, "It seems almost universally accepted that an intentional and thoughtful act of self-sacrifice can not only deepen spiritual connections with the Sacred, but also make us all more mindful of the excesses with which we are prone to live and grow oblivious to."[1]

I encourage us all to discover a spiritual practice this Lenten season. The tragic war in Ukraine and the earthquakes in Turkey and Syria, all remind me of the fragility of life. I am grieving these situations and asking God to direct us in how we might respond. It's often easier for me to go to my optimistic side and ignore the suffering. There is learning in the dungeon of sickness as well. May we all find the blessing of a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ and others on our Lenten paths.


Treasurer's Article

No. 50 years after the passage of the landmark federal Clean Water Act, 50% of all assessed rivers, streams, and lakes in the U.S. are too polluted for fishing, swimming, or drinking.

And climate change threatens to further degrade these resources, possibly leading to widespread water shortages by mid-century.




