

One of the greatest things about our Church is the way we care and serve each other. Many of you do this daily and we never hear about all the beautiful deeds you do. So, I offer a huge thank you to you all. **One of the groups that specifically addresses** 



**individual needs is our Parish Care Team.** They are always ready to help when asked. Recently they have had a deluge of needs to fulfill and we are so grateful for this ministry.

I thought it might help to explain a bit more what this team can and cannot do.

\*They can deliver meals for a short period of time. \*They can see that you get a ride to the doctor or to the store. \*They can pick up medications and other supplies for you on a temporary basis.

\*They pray and visit with you, offering spiritual and emotional support.

All of this is short term. If someone needs long term help in their home, this is not the mission of the Parish Care Team. **Our members of this team are trained in being confidential, listening, and caring with empathetic hearts**. They can get you some help in a crisis.

It is not appropriate for them to: \*clean your home \*help you bathe or get dressed \*transport you to standing appointments every week \*provide daily meals for longer than two weeks \*receive phone call after reasonable hours \*offer therapeutic counseling

While our Parish Care Team are true angels and comfort us beyond measure, they cannot do everything. There are other agencies that can provide these services. You can call the church office or Pastor Bonnie and you will be directed to where you can receive aid. We have lists of agencies and brochures in the social hall as well.

The 2024 budget process has begun. At the Council meeting in September, I handed out to committee chairs the budget request form. This form is used to determine each committee's budget for next year. These forms are due to me

at the October Council meeting. After this information is received the Budget committee, which consists of the Treasurer, Financial Secretary, Moderator, a member of the Pastor Relations committee and the Chair of the Personnel committee meet. Then the Budget committee will generate a proposed budget and present to the Finance and Facilities committee for approval. If approved, it will go to the Council for approval, and then to the Congregation for approval on December 10th.There are usually changes and modifications along the way. #### **BOOK STUDY SPECIAL GUEST**

Our thriving Book Study Group is enjoying THE BOOK OF JOY by His Holiness the Dalai Lama and Archbishop Desmond TuTu.

The Dalai Lama states that a question that he gets more than any other is "how could they possibly live with joy in a world so filled with sorrow and suffering, not just theirs, but others?" The Archbishop responds with "people are capable of fantastic goodness." Doctors Without Borders go to all parts of the world into poverty stricken, dangerous places ravaged by poor health and disease. They are showing their humanity/compassion and we have two past members of our congregation who did just that as many of you do today.

Nancy Burton, recently came to share the story of her parents, Dr. Clark Burton and Carol Burton. In 1991 they became part of a dental clinic that traveled to Nepal. The little village of Namche Bazaar had never before seen a dentist or a technician.

Dr. Clark Burton and Carol Burton joined another physician to create a training program for technicians to work as dental therapists. Dr. Burton taught local people how to do root canals and many other dental procedures. Nancy has recreated their experience with articles, photos, and her mother's journal, all of which described conditions at 11,300 feet in a remote village. Even the landing field was very scary and getting through customs with a dental x-ray machine was a challenge.

Today, the dental clinic is located at the highest elevation in the world and serves local people. The facility is utilized by the Peace Corp and UNESCO, and provided therapies, fillings, cleanings, and an educational program for children. The sharing of this story allows us to envision how we might help others today. Come join us for our next special guest, Rev.
