

Treasurer's Article

Good news the Solar Project is complete and is paid for!!! The final payment was \$12, 300 and we had \$6000 in the Solar account. We only had to borrow an additional \$6300

from the Endowment funds. The final amount that we borrowed from the Endowment funds for this project is \$11,300, we had borrowed \$5000 last September. I will be working with Jenny on how much we are saving on our monthly electric bills and report on how the repayment is going.

Pledges continue to be paid and we are below expenses in most categories. The Finance and Facility Team just approved making a new Budget item for Angels Camp facilities for \$10,000. Thank you for all your support.

Vice-Moderator's Musings

Have you ever read the bylaws of our church? At this point in time we actually have two sets of bylaws, but we are currently following the ones previously prepared for the Murphys Church, last revised in 2020. Vicky Oneto and I



have volunteered to lead a committee whose task will be to review the two sets of bylaws and our current practices to determine what revisions are appropriate and needed. The goal will be to present the proposed amendment to Council and then to conduct a vote of the Congregation at the December Budget Meeting. If you are interested in joining this committee, please contact me.

So, why bother to have bylaws? Bylaws are the official legal document that defines an organization's purpose, governing structure, membership requirements, and types and frequency of meetings. To retain nonprofit status in California, bylaws are required to be filed with the Secretary of State. Since the year 2000, we have revised our bylaws nine times. Our bylaws include the following:

- the name, purpose, covenant, and government of our Church,
- a statement of our faith,
- qualifications for membership,
- worship services and meetings to be held,
- voting procedures,
- officers' and council members' election and duties,
- teams and committees and their functions,
- auxiliary organizations, and
- general policies.

As stated before, we will not change the legal name of our church at this time, but there are some provisions that need updating now. We will consider revisions to officers' and committees' duties. We may also consider other proposals to change By-law provisions and policies. I invite you to read our current bylaws and provide any comments or recommendations you have.

~ Did you know that Square Dancing is our official National Dance?

In 1986 Congress voted that Square Dance be designated the national dance of the United States. So it's actually patriotic to have fun!

~ Did you know that square dancing could improve your chances of avoiding dementia?

AARP colcluded that, "If there is only one thing you choose to do, dance." [AARP Bulletin October 2019]. Square dancing is an especially good form of dancing for increasing brain activity because a dancer must hear the name of the movement ("call"), then execute that movement: ears to brain to hands and feet.





~ Did you know that one evening of square dancing will register all that day's required "steps" on your counter?

A typical square dancer can expect to clock at least 9,000 of those in an evening of dancing. And dancers don't contend with extremes of weather like hikers, bikers, golfers. We're indoors.

These are general aspects of square dancing that all square dancers appreciate. Norm and I have some personal reasons for loving this hobby, (not just the fact that, each of us, having lost a beloved spouse to death, found a new love and life partner on the dance floor).

FRIENDSHIP Honestly, there are as many hugs and welcoming smiles at a square dance workshop or dance as there are in church on any given Sunday.

WHOLESOMENESS Square dance clubs' bylaws forbid any drugs or alcohol, making square dancing a great family recreation. Dancers can range from 9 to 90. Homeschoolers can meet PE requirements. One of our club members is a 12-Stepper and he says square dancing does more for him than meetings do.

TEAMWORK Eight of you work together to successfully get through all the "calls" of a dance ~ that's the teamwork* mentioned above. We help each other attain the level of complication that's comfortable for each person. State Square Dance has 50 calls, Mainstream level has 65, Plus level has 100. A few dancers go on to A-level and "Challenge."

MUSIC Callers, like the rest of us, like every music genre, so you might hear all sorts of music that the callers have composed dances to. It's really not "hillbilly" music only.

PORTABILITY Henry Ford financed standardization of the calls to be found all over the U.S. So when you are traveling (Attention, RV-ers!) you can find clubs in many towns, counties, states, and even foreign countries, dance comfortably with them and be warmly welcomed .

Because Norm and I love this hobby so much, we want to see it grow, spread in popularity. We have one club in our county: The Calaveras Twirlers. So please come to our Open House at San Andreas Town Hall on Tuesday, October 3 at 6:30 to give us a try. You'll be glad you did.
