### Pastor's Article

Why Celebrate Adent?

This time of year Avent can get lost in all the planning of Christmas and yet here at the parish we continue our traditions and liturgies to help us focus on the Hope of Christ.

In Advent, we proclaim and celebrate our hope and our trust that our God is faithful: that God will come again and again to rescue us, to heal us, and to console us. God calls us forward to a new world, to embrace a new future. That is God's deeper gift to us. God's call is not to return to a wonderful place where "everything was wonderful"—be that Bethlehem or the 'wonderful world' of our shared past.

We begin with hope but we know that for many, it is also framed by the experience of loss and continuing grief. Our anticipation of the joy of Christmas is all the greater for the depth of the crisis through which we have been travelling. Christian hope is not naive. It does not give rise to nostalgia, denial or conformity. Rather it is realistic in its faithfulness and bold in its imagination. Pope Francis tells us that hope 'is able to see a tomorrow; hope is the door that opens onto the future.' Hope changes everything.


It is my prayer that you will fully participate in the Advent workshop, the daily devotionals provided to you and attend worship faithfully each Sunday. We are stronger by being together!

### A Response to the Nugget Article About Recycling from Janis Ossa

I will be quoting from a July 15, 2024 article in Time Magazine:

- RECYCLE REDUCTION OF THE PROPERTY OF THE PROPE
- Only 10% of plastics being manufactured are recycled/recyclable.
- One quarter of the more than 16,000 chemicals added to plastics to produce useful characteristics (flexibility, water repellency, etc.) are known to be linked to inflammatory bowel disease, cancer, autism, ADHD, Type 2 Diabetes, disruption to the endocrine system, causing problems with fertility, immunity, and development.
- Humans have produced more than 11 billion metric tons of plastic since 1950. Only two billion tons of that are still used today.
- "Micro-plastics and nano-plastics" that are produced when plastic breaks down can be found almost everywhere in the human body from blood to breast milk.
- Some plastic is essential medical equipment like blood bags and flexible tubing, but disposable plastic forks less so. "Eliminating disposable plastics would go a long way toward improving health."

Let us resolve to use as few disposable plastics as possible and prolong the life of any that we must use.
