## Pastor's Article

Recently, as part of my continuing education, I spent a week at San Damiano in Danville on a silent retreat.

People often ask me, what happens on a silent retreat?

How can you stay quiet for so long?

So, first of all, don't assume that just because I love to talk that I can't be still. I have a good legacy of spending time in silence and being renewed with God. These times of silence enable me to listen, to pray, to meditate and to reaffirm my call to ministry. It is also an awakening to new possibilities and praying for others.

San Damiano is a perfect place for such a retreat. The grounds are lovely, and they have a labyrinth and walk with the stations of the cross. There are magnificent views of Mt Diablo. The room at San Damiano is meager with a bed, desk and a small private bath. It is perfect for praying without distractions.

In the gospel of Mark, Jesus tells the disciples to come aside and rest awhile. He knew how important it is to get respite from the demands of the world. Our lives are full of distractions. We are often left over-stimulated with too much noise as our daily existence becomes excessive and filled with unhealthy habits and niggling thoughts. A silent retreat is an experience over a given time that brings us back to the present moment. Here, life is no longer a distraction but a sanctuary to sit with our inner worlds. Our effort to answer these questions will prompt conversations, explorations, storytelling, and many prayers. This process is part of our stewardship. # Treasurer Report


The Budget committee is busy working on the budget for next year. It seems like just yesterday when we developed this year's budget. Please remember to turn in your pledge cards as soon as you can.

investments continue to do well and expenses are down for this year.


Also make sure that you remember to pay your 2024 pledges this year.

Congratulations, Dianne and Jodie!








# **End to the Recycling Program**

After a decade of fund-raising to support the church, the time has come to end the recycling program originally begun by Fred Soderer and Ken Grassmeyer as a fund-raiser for the then-active Men's Fellowship. Participation has dropped, we've had a consistent theft problem, and the expense of transporting materials has forced us to make this decision.

For several years the program provided local scholarships, donations to the local food bank and more than \$1,000 a year to church fundraising efforts. That support and income has dropped dramatically post-Covid.

We want to thank everyone who has supported this effort through the years, and encourage everyone to continue to recycle and reduce waste in an effort to help the environment. If anyone has a suggestion for a way to do so, please share your ideas with the Outreach and Social Justice team.
