Pastor's Article

Recently as I have been meeting with many of you and as we pray together, I am discovering that one of the great challenges for many of us, is the ability to let go of things we cannot change. I am reading a great book; The Five Things We Cannot Change and the Happiness We Find by Embracing Them by David Richo.



Richo suggests that when we say yes to the "givens" of life, this is a "yes" to the paradoxes of life. An example is this:

"We can make commitments even though plans fall through. We can maintain our compassion no matter how unjust the world may be to us. We can be loving toward others no matter how cruelly they act toward us. We can recognize people's dark side and yet we do not give up on them, another feature of spiritual maturity." [1]

He goes on to say, each time we practice saying yes to life, amid the pains and struggles, we grow in patience, forbearance, forgiveness, generosity, wisdom, appreciation, perseverance, and unconditional love.[2]

This is the way of Jesus and as I am learning to take one moment at a time and give up control of what I think needs to happen, peace resides in my soul. This is a continuation of what having breast cancer has taught me and the work with my Buddhist teacher, Vinod.

Each moment is a gift from God. Letting go of the need to control the moments is indeed a blessing. This Advent season, may we learn to say yes to life and experience wholeness and peace. If you find yourself struggling in this season, when the Christmas decorations and music are already on full display, join us at our Taizé service on Wednesday, December 6 for a time of quiet reflection and to create space for the acknowledgment of the heaviness often carried during this season, as well as offering the hope that Jesus gives.

A Blessed Advent to you all, Pastor Bonnie




Treasurer's Article


