Someone recently asked me, so what are you up to now? Are you still getting


treatments, how are you feeling and what's happening at church?

Be a Blessing!

Way back in 2016 Jeri Carson-Hull learned about a little free pantry project which stocked canned foods where hungry people in need could come to take supplies. She brought that idea back to our own Outreach and Social Justice Team. With their backing she approached the church council and got permission to establish such

a good idea here at our church. Thus was born the Blessing Box which is on the front porch of the Eastman Education Center. Jeri has been in charge of this successful venture ever since, eight years of supplying foods, now also some basic health items, for the homeless and/or just financially insecure people of our town. The Blessing Box is filled three times a week.

Jeri has the assistance of a few volunteers and Education Director Patty Haskell has organized the Sunday School children to help stock the Blessing Box on Sundays. Murphys Senior Center has shared some of their grant money with the project and our own council has supported it as well. Jeri orders mainly online and some supportive church members check local discount stores for food bargains to contribute.

The rewards include touching thank you notes left at the Blessing Box and even some recipients who have knocked on the door of committee meetings in Eastman Center to express their appreciation.
