1 Samuel 17

MOSES PARTING THE SEA

Exodus 14

After the Israelites escape Egypt, Pharaoh changes his mind and pursues them with his army. Trapped at the Red Sea, Moses, guided by God, raises his staff, and the sea parts, allowing the Israelites to cross on dry ground. When the Egyptians follow, the waters return, drowning them. This miracle demonstrates God's power and protection.

MOSES PARTING THE SEA

Why were the Israelites trapped at the Red Sea?

They were fleeing from Pharaoh's army, which was pursuing them after they left Egypt.

What did Moses do to part the sea?

Moses raised his staff, and God caused the sea to part, creating a dry path for the Israelites.

What happened to the Egyptian army?

The waters returned, drowning the Egyptian army when they tried to follow the Israelites.

Book of Job

What happened to Job at the end of the story?

God restored Job's fortunes and blessed him with even more than he had before.



THIRTY PIECES OF SILVER

Matthew 26:14-16, 27:3-10

Judas Iscariot agrees to betray Jesus to the religious leaders for thirty pieces of silver. After Jesus is condemned, Judas regrets his actions and tries to return the money, but it is too late. He throws the silver into the temple and later takes his own life. This story highlights the consequences of greed and betrayal.

Why did Judas betray Jesus?

How did Judas feel after betraying Jesus?

What happened to the thirty pieces of silver?



THIRTY PIECES OF SILVER

Why did Judas betray Jesus?

Judas betrayed Jesus for thirty pieces of silver, motivated by greed.

How did Judas feel after betraying Jesus?

Judas regretted his actions and tried to return the money.

What happened to the thirty pieces of silver?

Judas threw the silver into the temple, and the priests used it to buy a potter's field.
