REVITALIZING A STRATEGIC PORT: A NEW MODEL FOR GLOBAL PARTNERSHIP

Overview

Zura Group is leading the redevelopment and operation of a major Caribbean port under a buildoperate model that marks the first time an American team has stepped in to redevelop and manage a port originally built under the Belt and Road framework. The initiative represents a turning point in international infrastructure cooperation, blending U.S. engineering standards, sustainable investment, and transparent governance into a next-generation port project.

Challenge

The existing facility, originally developed by foreign interests, suffered both physical damage and operational stagnation following a series of natural and economic disruptions. Despite its strategic position near vital Atlantic trade routes, the port remained underutilized, requiring capital infusion, world-class engineering, and operational reform to unlock its potential.

Zura Solution

Zura Group assembled a consortium of global partners across maritime engineering, cruise operations, infrastructure finance, and logistics. The program includes full channel dredging, cargo and cruise terminals, fuel storage, and commercial development supported by renewable-energy infrastructure. The build-operate model ensures both short-term efficiency and long-term alignment with the host nation's economic goals. U.S. government agencies have expressed formal support for the redevelopment, recognizing its strategic value and its demonstration of how American partnerships can provide credible, market-driven alternatives to legacy infrastructure models.

Outcome

The port redevelopment has become a regional benchmark for public-private partnership, job creation, and sustainable development. The project is expected to create thousands of direct and indirect jobs, generate billions in economic value, and serve as a platform for local industry growth. Beyond infrastructure, it represents a symbolic shift—showcasing how transparent, U.S.-aligned investment can modernize and operate global trade hubs once dominated by Belt and Road capital.
