Thanks goes out to Steve Sherwood, Zeb Youngman and his daughters, Alex and Emmie. Our contractor, Charlie Prott and his helper Freddie provided needed muscle. A new perch was added.

There was concern that the platform would not be in place in time for the breeding season. The osprey normally returns to the same nest year after year. Thanks to our quick work, we made it just in time as evidenced by the great shot of the returning Osprey taken by Zeb Youngman about two weeks after the work.

The bench had been toppled (as was the osprey nest) by winter storms and high tides. New holes were dug and the bench was repositioned and backfilled.
