Maternal and Child Health

- Increase maternity care providers
- Promote evidencebased home visiting
- Expand access to maternal mental health



Infant- Toddler Education &Care

- Expand income eligibility to quality infant/toddler care
- Expand early literacy & school readiness
- Increase early childhood workforce



Early Intervention

- Increase early intervention workforce & services
- Streamline screening and connection programs



Economic & Family Supports

- Promote workforce childcare subsidies
- Expand eligibility for health coverage
- Expand paid maternal and family leave



ACEs, Trauma & Resilience

- Increase infant & family mental health services
- Increase efforts to reduce child abuse
