Peace! A Natural Result of Thanksgiving!

Where does peace come from? Is it knowing God hears our prayer? To a degree, yes. But what if we are praying wrong?

Is it expecting God to answer our prayer? To a degree, yes. But what if He has different plans for us?

Philippians 4:6-7 says "Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." (ESV)

Of course prayer is essential to us having peace. We take all things to God, as He desires us to do. But the source of peace goes beyond merely asking of God. It is the confidence that we have in Him as we pray. He gets it right when we get it wrong. He knows, with true perspective, when we are caught up in our little world. Peace comes as we interact with Him, and leave it there, as we trust Him by faith to continue to be faithful in our lives. We are giving thanks even as we pray, because we know of this faithfulness. This is our source of peace.

Peace comes from the heart that is thankful as it prays (confident in His appropriate response). We can rest in Him as we take our heart's concerns to Him. In a sense, my thankfulness is equivalent to faith in Him.

I am thankful that He has it under control - I trust Him by faith that He does not create chaos. I am thankful that He will work all things so that I grow in Christ - I trust Him by faith to always be at the task - I trust Him by faith to always be active in my life.

We think of thankfulness as a reflection of praise for what He has already done. And it is. I am reminded of His faithfulness in my life and give thanks for it. However, I also have faith that He continues that work even now and into the future. I am thankful (an act of faith) because I am confident, that He is active in my life now and will be into the future.

By faith I release my cares and trust in Him. I am at peace because I am already thankful for what He will do.

As we approach a national time of thanksgiving, let us reflect on what God has already done in our lives, and give thanks. But also let us anticipate God still at work and give thanks for what He continues to do – He will continue to be faithful. As we do, we will find the peace of God that comes to those who live by faith – or can I say, live thankful for what God will yet do in our lives.
