Thinking about Life

Time to plant the garden. How unlikely to produce results, it seems.

You buy a packet from the store. Inside are dead looking things. Black, not green. In fact, they came from the last stages of some plant, just before it withered and died. Just a roundish, black thing. Itty bitty. No leaves. No roots. They don't look like what you want them to be. You can set them on the counter, and nothing happens. They just lay there --seemingly dead.

Yet, a miracle will occur. You bury them in nasty looking dirt and walk away. A little rain. A little sun. And then suddenly, life springs forth. Just a hopeful stalk and a bit of a leaf. But, then a miniplant. And ultimately a full fledged replica of its source. And finally it produces fruit. It has became what it was intended to be.

So it is in our own world. We were dead-like things. In fact, we were totally dead. But when (if?) we trusted Christ, something new was created. At first it might not look like much. But given some water and nourishment, it springs out. New life shows its face. And from little, unlikely beginnings, it begins to take shape. Until one begins to see the creator in this new life. Maturity begins to take shape. And when the process is followed, fruit springs forth. Christ is the seed within us. His resurrection, enables Him to reproduce Himself within us when we take Him as Savior. And this new life grows and develops us into His image. This new life ultimately produces fruit abundantly, as we cooperate with Him.

The Bible uses terms like 'born again', 'new life', 'new creation', and many other pictures. In light of the upcoming celebration of Easter, let me use the term 'resurrection life'. When we trust Christ, He gives us this new resurrection life. We have within us this image of Christ. We won't just get eternal life some day. We have eternal life now. We already enjoy a new life in us. Powerful. The ability to look like Christ. The strength to persevere. The empowerment to become all that we were created to be. And the natural (supernatural) effect is that we produce fruit.

Christ accomplished all this on that first Easter. He died for our sin, removing the consequences and guilt, and giving us His righteousness. And through the Spirit that now indwells us, we have the same power that raised Him from the dead. A power that is there not to do weird things, but to transform and renew us. To transform us into the image of Christ. To produce a life of fruitfulness.

The gospel, Christ's death and

resurrection, accomplished salvation to deal with our past. But equally important, He now infuses us with resurrected life. A life that doesn't look like our ugly beginnings. But a life that looks like our Creator, our Savior, our Lord. And enables us to produce the fruit that shows who/what we really are.

May we cooperate. May we nurture this new life. May we desire for this new life to truly change us so that we are mature – looking like our Savior and producing fruit for the benefit of others. Time to plant and nurture this garden within.
