Thinking about Death

My, what a morbid title. Death!! I don't want to talk about it. I don't want to think about it. Yep, that would be a pretty common viewpoint. Yet, we are all terminal. We will all die. Some, a long time from now. Others, sooner that we expect. People suddenly very sick. People suddenly dying. Age creeping up on all of us. Death warrants a moment to think about it. Death has been on my mind recently.

What if death wasn't this great mystery? What if it wasn't something to be so afraid of that we don't want to talk about it, much less think about it or prepare for it? What if death were just moving from one room to another? What if death were just taking a trip to a great place?

We have taken lots of trips in our lives. As a family we typically took vacations every year. We would go places that we had never been. We would look forward to seeing things we had never seen. We would read ahead to get an idea of what to look forward to. We would determine the way there. We would prepare for the journey. We would gather everything together, and we would leave with great positive expectation. What if death were like this? Could it be?

In the last few days, I observed someone who modelled this so well. He had prepared well. He knew his destination. He knew who he was going to see. He had a positive expectation of a place that he had never been before. In the last hours before the trip, he took care of the remaining items that needed to be done. He

gave instructions to those who remained behind. His trip was imminent. And through it all, he kept saying, "I am about to leave".

And when all the preparations were done, he left. Like getting into a car and leaving. Were there perhaps last minute moments of anxiety (he had never been where he was going)? I don't know. If so, he still had a smile, a joke, a firm positive expectation. And he left.

As Paul wrestled with the idea of death, he commented, "For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain. If I am to live in the flesh, that means fruitful labor for me. Yet which I shall choose I cannot tell I am hard pressed between the two. My desire is to depart and be with Christ, for that is far better." (Philippians 1:21-23)

"For we know that if the tent that is our earthly home is destroyed, we have a building from God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens. For in this tent we groan, longing to put on our heavenly dwelling,

"So we are always of good courage. We know that while we are at home in the body we are away from the Lord, for we walk by faith, not by sight. Yes, we are of good courage, and we would rather be away from the body and at home with the Lord." (2 Corinthians 5:1-8)

Paul is not suicidal. But he is aware of the true reality. A day is coming when life here ends. And it is a transition. A moving from one room to another. A journey from this place to another place. The time of this transition is not in our hands – it is in

God's. But we can prepare for it. Knowing Christ as Savior. Serving Christ as Lord. Being encouraged, know that this troubled life will transition to one eternal with Christ. So Paul realizes that the time here is important, needing to be invested in others and in Christ. But the transition will be glorious. It is merely a time to leave to a new place. A new life. A marvelous place with a marvelous Savior. It will be 'time to leave'. And it will be ok.
