The success of Black History Month in February and Women's History Month in March led to the initiation of National Poetry Month in April by the Academy of American Poets The first-ever National Poetry Month was celebrated in 1996, but the history of poetry itself goes back to about thousands of years ago.

Dating back to 2100 B.C., the "Epic of Gilgamesh" is cited as the first-ever written piece of poetry, which tells an epic tale of a hero in ancient Mesopotamia.

Storytelling about history was quite popular until the 20th century but is rarely used nowadays. Ballads were a common way of capturing history during the Middle Ages. They were also used to announce news to kingdoms. An ode was a lyrical poem that glorified an event or person. It was also used in the past to tell stories about victories.

Aristotle described three genres of poetry: epic, comic, and tragic. This paved the way for poetry to flourish throughout Europe and the Middle East. However, these three genres were changed by aestheticians to epic, lyric, and dramatic. The genres of comic and tragic identified by Aristotle were combined into subcategories of the dramatic.





A message from Ms. DeGregorio:

This Marking Period students in Studio Art learned about the artist Jean-Michel Basquiat and his style of neo-expressionism often described as "chaotic brilliance." Jean-Michel Basquiat was known for creating multi-layered messages in his artwork in a raw uncensored style critiquing the racism prevalent in the art world and in America.

"I don't think about art when I work, I try to think about life." - Basquiat Student artists created artwork from this perspective, responding to the prompt, What do you think about when you think about life? Students created artworks exploring the multiplicity of issues present today: the war in the Ukraine, climate change, internal struggles, philosophical dichotomies, Covid, racism, being uprooted, how humans treat each other, identity, gender, abortion, anxiety, technology, life philosophy, fear, personal stories and more. Their artwork was inspired by Basquiat's style and approach to art making. Basquiat would often have multiple references present, "sampling," in his artwork and would layer meaning in a complex composition filled with symbols and words probing one to look deeply. Our student artists created deeply meaningful compositions that give you a glimpse of what's on their minds. We hope you visit our lobby gallery.
