COVID-19 Guidance

This guidance provides best practice considerations for schools for the 2022-2023 school year to help prevent the transmission of COVID-19 among students and staff.

- ✓ Vaccination: Vaccination is the best way to reduce COVID-19 risk. Encourage up to date COVID-19 vaccination for everyone six months or older.
 - Visit the <u>Vaccine Finder page (Open external link)</u> or call 877-829-4692 to find a location near you.
 - Up to date includes boosters for everyone who is eligible and additional primary shots for some immunocompromised people. See <u>At-A-Glance COVID-19</u> <u>Vaccination Schedules (cdc.gov) (Open external link).</u>
 - Vaccination Requirements:
 - Vaccination is still required for all visitors entering school buildings
 - Vaccination is still required for all DOE employees
 - Vaccination is still required for other individuals who work in DOE buildings
 - Vaccinations is still required to participate in high-risk extracurricular activities (band, orchestra, chorus, musical theatre, dance/dance team, marching band, cheerleading, step teams, flag teams) including high-risk PSAL sports (football, volleyball, basketball, wrestling, lacrosse, stunt, and rugby).

✓ Daily Health Screener:

- No longer required to enter school buildings.
- ✓ Stay home if sick: Students and staff should stay home if they show any symptoms of COVID-19 or other illnesses and get tested for COVID-19.
- ✓ **Isolate if COVID-19 positive:** Students and staff who test positive for COVID-19 must isolate for 5 days and can return to school on day 6 if they have no symptoms or symptoms are improving. They must wear mask until day 10 after symptom onset or date of positive test, whichever is earlier.
 - These cases should be reported to their school so they can be report into the sit room for exposure notifications.
- ✓ Get tested if exposed to COVID-19: Students and staff who are exposed to COVID-19 should get tested.
 - These individuals should receive home tests from their school and take two tests, at least 24 hours apart on day 4 and day 5 of their exposure. All exposed individuals should monitor for fever and other COVID-19 symptoms for 10 days after their exposure. If symptoms begin, they should not attend school and should isolate and get tested for COVID-19 again right away.

✓ Testing:

- Starting the first day of school, schools will offer home test kits to those with a potential in-school exposure and those with symptoms
- In addition, each staff and student will receive 4 tests per month to take home.
 These tests can be used by school families for testing due to symptoms, exposures, high-risk activity (such as travel and large gatherings), and can give staff and students immediate results.
- o In-school PCR surveillance testing will not be a part of the 2022-23 school year.

- ✓ Masking- Face coverings are strongly recommended to be worn when indoors. Masks will be made available at the school for all those who need/want them.
 - Students and staff, regardless of vaccination status, are required to wear a mask when:
 - Returning to school on the sixth day after testing positive for COVID-19, through day 10 after symptom onset or date of positive test, whichever is earlier, including when traveling on a school bus.
 - Entering the school medical room, nurse's office, or school-based health center.
 - Exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19 at school.
 - Students and staff, regardless of vaccination status, are strongly recommended to wear a mask:
 - When they were exposed to someone with COVID-19, whether the exposure occurred in school or outside of school. The person should wear a mask for 10 days after their last day of exposure and get tested at least 24 hours apart on day 4 and day 5 of their exposure.
 - When they are moderately-to-severely immunocompromised, and masking is recommended by their healthcare provider.
 - In crowded indoor settings
- Please complete the NYC financial forms, formerly known as Lunch Forms. While lunch
 is currently given to all students regardless of income, schools still need parents to
 complete in order to qualify for federal Title I funding. All information submitted by
 parents is completely confidential. A hard copy will be given to students on the first
 day of school to be completed and returned to Ms. Bernabel.
- PTA/SLT Meetings: PTA/SLT meetings are held on the first Monday of every month. Stay tuned for the time and day of the September meeting which sometimes takes place later in the month. SLT commences at 4 pm and ends at 5 pm. PTA meetings commence at 6 pm to 7 pm. Additionally, meetings will be held virtually and in person (hybrid) until further notice from the DOE on any changes or options for the new school year. An email with the Zoom links will be sent to parents the prior week.
- Computers/Laptops will be distributed to students who need one on the first day of classes. These laptops should be carried to school daily since they will be needed for instructional use while in the building.
- The following are documents students will be given on the first day of school which must be completed by parents and handed to Ms.
 Bernabel:
 - Emergency Contact Card
 - ➤ Military Parent Letter: This form requests information regarding the military activeduty status of parents and guardians. Parents who are not on active duty can disregard this form. Parents who completed this form in prior years must complete it again. For every family who submits a survey response indicating that the student's parent or guardian is on military active duty, you or your designees must use the BINU screen in ATS to enter 'M' in the District C field.

This is the 2022–23 school year calendar for all 3K–12 NYCDOE public schools. If your child attends a private, parochial, charter school, NYCEEC Early Childhood Community-Based Organization or Family Childcare Program, please contact your child's school for information about their calendar. Please note the following:

- November 8, Election Day, is a non-attendance day for students. No in-person or remote instruction will be provided.
- On "Snow days" or days when school buildings are closed due to an emergency, all students and families should plan on participating in remote learning.
- Individual schools' Parent-Teacher Conference dates might be different from the dates below. Your child's teacher will work with you to schedule your conference.
- On this schedule, elementary schools are defined as programs that serve kindergarten (K) through grade 8, including schools with 3K and Pre-K, as well as those that end in grade 5. Middle schools are defined as programs that serve grades 6–8, and high schools are defined as programs that serve grades 9–12.
