
October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month

Domestic Violence Awareness Month (DVAM) History

Domestic Violence Awareness Month (DVAM) evolved from the "Day of Unity" held in October 1981 and conceived by the National Coalition Against Domestic Violence. The intent was to connect advocates across the nation who were working to end violence against women and their children. The Day of Unity soon became an entire week devoted



to a range of activities conducted at the local, state, and national level. The activities conducted were as varied and diverse as the program sponsors but had common themes:

Mourning those who have died because of domestic violence

Celebrating those who have survived

Connecting those who work to end violence

These three themes remain a key focus of DVAM events today. In October 1987, the first Domestic Violence Awareness Month was observed. That same year marks the initiation of the first national domestic violence toll-free hotline. In 1989, the U.S. Congress passed Public Law 101-112 designating October of that year as National Domestic Violence Awareness Month. Such legislation has passed every year since with National Coalition Against Domestic Violence providing key leadership in this effort. Each year, the Day of Unity is celebrated the first Monday of Domestic Violence Awareness Month.

Domestic violence is the leading cause of homelessness among families in New York City – surpassing eviction in FY17.

This is often done through fear and intimidation over a period of time, using threats, and verbal, emotional, or physical abuse. Domestic violence can happen to anyone, and everyone deserves to feel safe and respected.

If you are in a relationship with an abusive partner and you fear for your safety, you can seek help by calling Safe Horizon's Domestic Violence Hotline at 1-800-621-HOPE (4673). Help is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. However, if you are in immediate danger, then you should call 911 right away.


- Reach out to Ms. Bernabel if you have not registered for your NYC Myschools account.










JKO is once again chosen for our students to attend a viewing of the Broadway hit, "Hamilton"!!!


