- Student lockers will be assigned on the last week of September.
- Student OMNY (Transportation Passes) cards will be distributed on the first day of school. Students can use OMNY passes beginning September 1–August 31, 2025, as long as they remain eligible (grade and distance) throughout the school year.

- Please complete the NYC financial forms, formerly known as Lunch Forms. While lunch is
 currently given to all students regardless of income, schools still need parents to complete in
 order to qualify for federal Title I funding. All information submitted by parents is completely

- PTA/SLT Meetings: PTA/SLT meetings are held on the first Monday of every month. Stay tuned
 for the time and day of the September meeting which sometimes takes place later in the
 month. SLT commences at 4 pm and ends at 5 pm. PTA meetings commence at 6 pm to 7
 pm. Additionally, meetings will be held virtually and in person (hybrid). An email with the Zoom
 links will be sent to parents ten days in advance.
- Computers/Laptops will be distributed to students who need one during the second week of school. These laptops should be carried to school daily since they will be needed for instructional use while in the building.

JKO Cell Phone and Electronic Device Policy

At JKO, we believe a focused learning environment is key to our students' success. This letter serves as a reminder of our policy on cell phones and other electronic devices, which aligns with New York State law and the NYC Public Schools' Chancellor's Regulation A-413.

Policy Details

Leave Non-Phone Electronics at Home: To minimize distractions and ensure a productive learning atmosphere, students should leave all personal electronic devices, other than cell phones, at home. This includes smartwatches, earbuds, earphones, and personal tablet computers. School-issued devices are the only electronics permitted for academic use.

Collection of Non-Phone Electronics: If students bring any electronics other than a cell phone, those items will be collected at the school's entrance and returned at the end of the school day.

Securing Cell Phones: Students are required to secure their cell phones in the provided pouch upon entering the school building. Each student has a designated pouch for this purpose. The pouch will be unlocked by staff when the student leaves the building at the end of the school day.

Pouch Responsibility: Students are responsible for the care of their pouch. A 20.00 replacement fee will be charged for any pouch that is intentionally damaged or destroyed.

Parental Contact of Student: If a parent wishes to contact their child during the school day, they should call the school and we will make their child available.

Disciplinary Actions

Violations of this policy will result in disciplinary action consistent with the NYC Department of Education's Behavioral Expectations for Students. Actions are progressive and based on the nature and frequency of the violation. These may include:

- A verbal warning.
- Confiscation of the electronic device, to be returned at the end of the school day.
- Confiscation of the electronic device, to be returned only after a mandatory parent conference.
- Seizure of the electronic device, to be returned once the student signs a behavioral contract.
- Suspension for repeated offenses.







